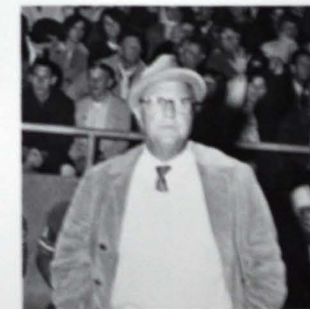
In Memoriam Miss Edna King Cross

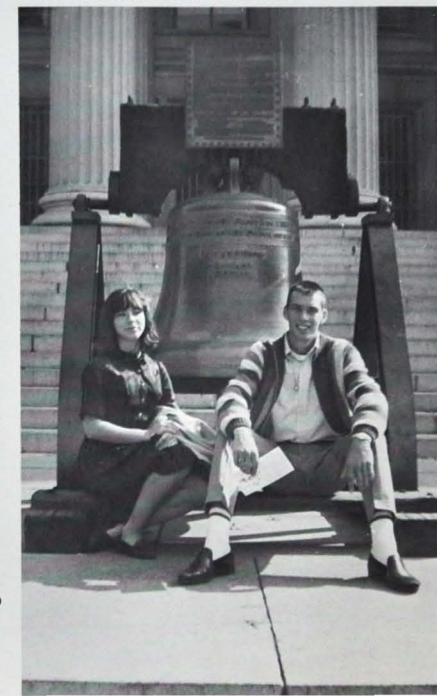

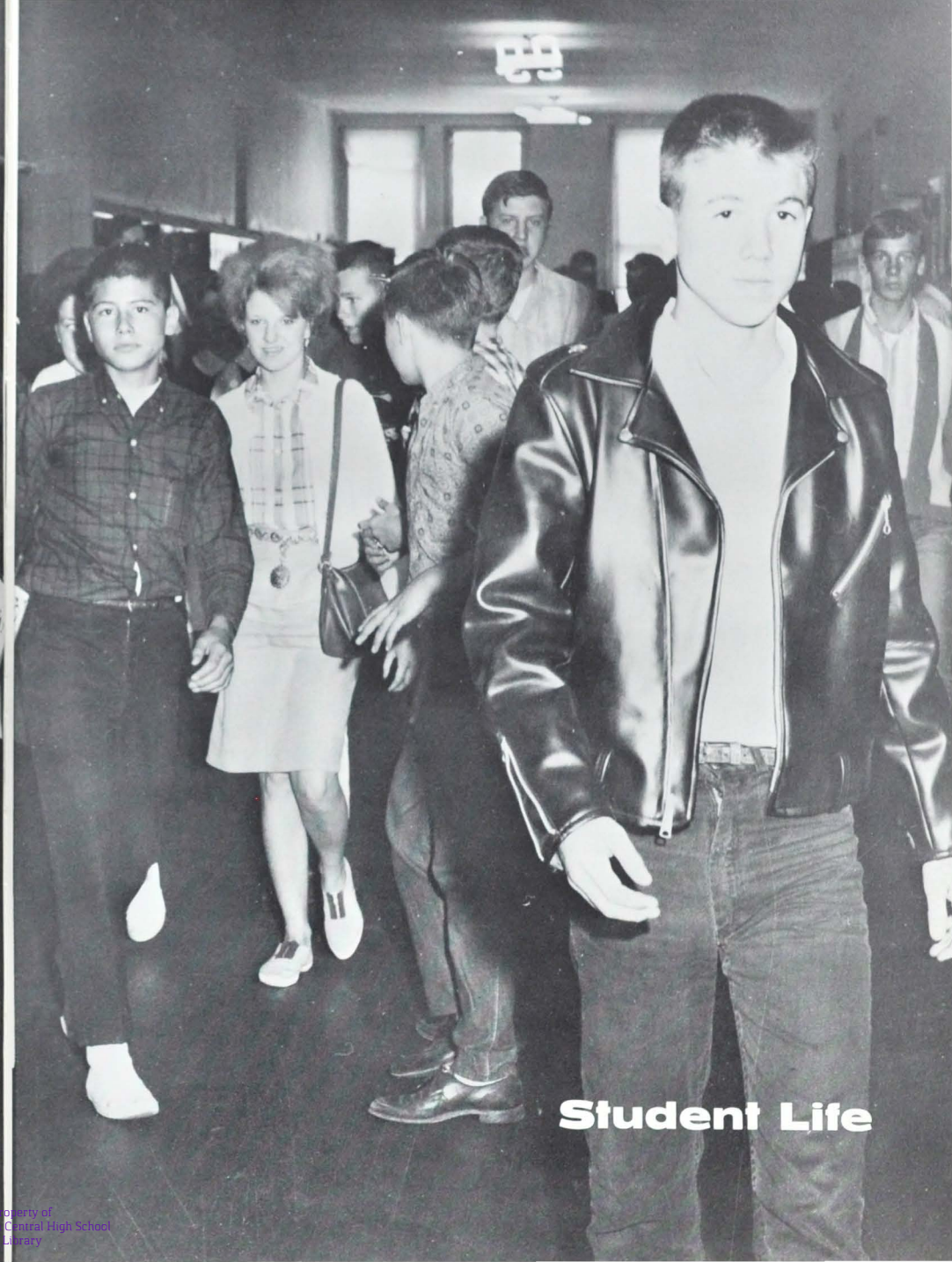
Presented To West Side School

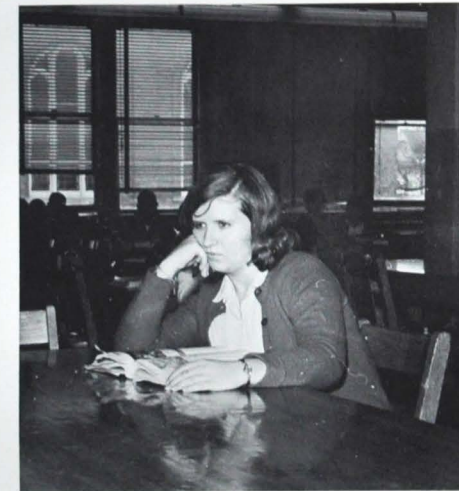

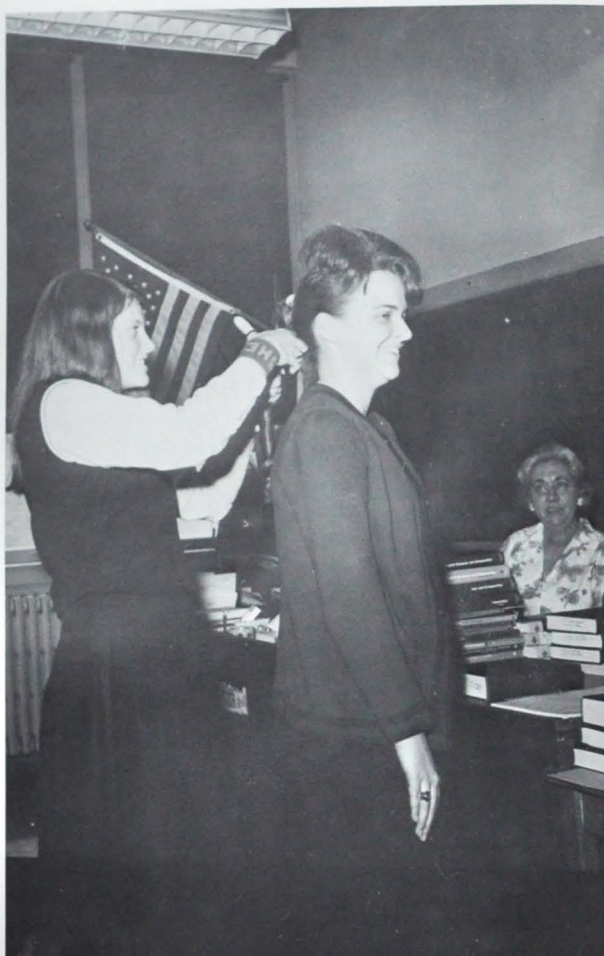

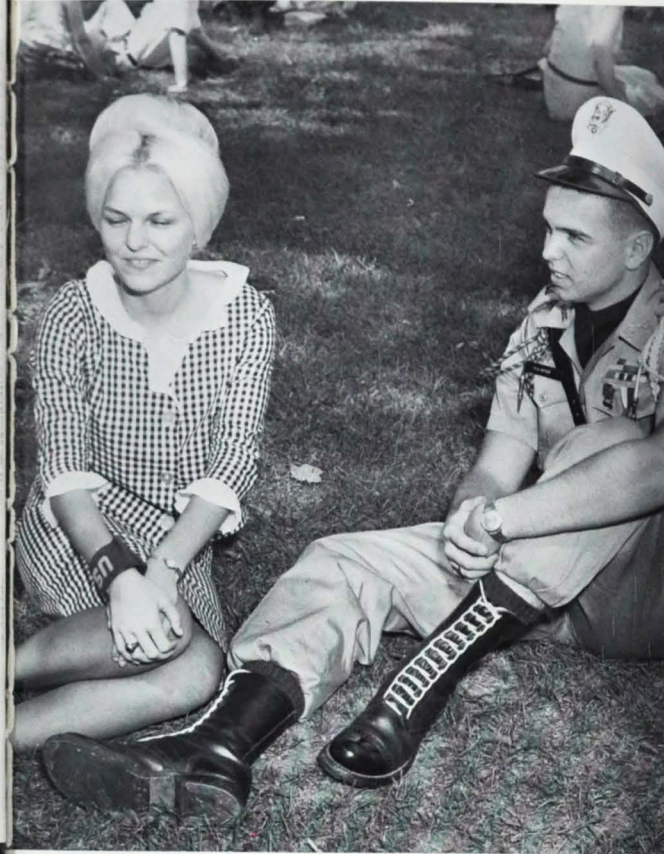

The purpose of the Art Department is to give a special means for personal and individual experience, thus helping to increase the realization of one's own worth as a human being capable of doing something worthwhile, and responsible for using well his peculiar abilities. Experience is offered in drawing with pencil, ink, charcoal, chalks, and other mediums; in watercolor and oil paints; in ceramics, in weaving, in sculpture of wood, clay, stone, metal, and other materials; in print making; in stitchery; and various other crafts. Preceding these activities every art student studies the basic elements of design. A library of about 500 volumes is kept in the art department and is immediately available when needed. The class room is well equipped for a limited number of students in the fields offered.

Department of English

The English Department, composed of twelve teachers, offers a varied curriculum planned on three levels of instruction: accelerated, average, and remedial, for grades seven through twelve. In addition to the basic courses in composition, vocabulary, and drill, special features of the department are courses in reading (both remedial and speed reading are offered), journalism (beginning and advanced), creative writing, mythology (Greek and Roman), speech, dramatics, and English 12-s (which emphasizes the speech arts and may be taken by seniors only, in lieu of the regular English course). The English Department sponsors both school publications, the weekly **Digest** and the yearbook, the **Champion**.

The department takes great pride in its well-qualified staff (five of whom hold Master's degrees). The years of service total one hundred and seventy-one years for members of the department.

The Business Education Department offers a curriculum consisting of the following subjects: two years of bookkeeping, shorthand, and typewriting; office training; general business; one semester of business law and salesmanship. From these ten subjects, students are able to secure the necessary training for employment upon graduation, in one of the following office positions: bookkeeping, clerical, secretarial, or stenographic. Basic business education courses—bookkeeping, business law, general business, and typewriting—provide the skills, the understanding and appreciation of the business world that all high school graduates need for a more successful life.

The college-bound student also has a choice of courses which will prove very beneficial in his work. Typewriting should be taken by all college-bound students.

The Future Business Leaders of America, an active organization on campus, is made of students who are enrolled in business subjects.

Department of Business Education



The study of a foreign language, like any other subject a pupil may elect, should be considered for its value to the individual and to society.

In our Foreign Language Department we are trying to develop facility in reading and writing the language, together with a more realistic approach to understanding and speaking the language.

To achieve the latter, the role of the laboratory in the modern foreign language program looms increasingly important since it provides regular practice in listening and repeating the foreign language as presented by educated natives.

Listening practice is intended to lead to the ability to understand the spoken language and the acquisition of a language should be of real value in attaining this goal, not to mention its value as a means of motivating the student in his language efforts.

Guidance is an organized program through which we help boys and girls to understand and to use wisely their educational, vocational, and personal potentialities, and the opportunities which they have, or can develop. With such concern, a wholesome climate should prevail for all students to develop in a positive manner. Counselors are willing to assist students with problems related to choices of curriculum, academic progress, and college or career planning, as well as personal problems which may affect the student's adjustment. Mr. Hale is the director of the program at Central, and Mr. Brown and Mrs. Okrasinski are assisting counselors. Guidance services focus upon individual pupils. These services are thought of as organized activities designed to give systematic aid to pupils to assist in their learning about the large, complex, and changing world of opportunities.

Department of Home Economics

Students in the Home Economics Department get acquainted with problems met by the entire family; physical, social, material, emotional.

Consideration of individual problems such as reducing diets, personal grooming, and proper styling of clothes adds to the self confidence of the individual.

One of the basic objectives of Home Economics is to raise the standards of home living. This purpose is provided by a program which includes budgeting, management, child care, clothing, planning and preparing balanced meals, house planning, home furnishings, and consumer living.

Students acquire a better understanding of the importance of proper selections and use of personal items, a broader knowledge in buying foods and textiles; develop a better understanding of the effects food nutrients have on health, physical growth and well being; learn about planning for the housing needs of the family; learn to make better use of time and energy, develop personality traits helpful in meeting life situations.

History

The chief objective of the History Department is to train the pupil for effective citizenship in our dynamic society. This means that he must have an awareness of the democratic processes and a willingness to participate. He must realize that quality citizenship requires an assumption of duties as well as rights.

The department recognizes that we are living in the most exciting and significant era in history; therefore, we have set goals to fulfill the needs of our pupils to meet the great challenge.

Instruction is directed toward increasing the store of dependable knowledge and providing the opportunity for creative and analytical thinking on social, economic and political issues. We attempt this in an intellectual and ethical atmosphere.

Students are offered opportunities in courses of Tennessee History, United States History, Bible, World History, and American History.

Department of History

The Industrial Arts Department is led by Mr. J. J. Fletcher. This department includes mechanical drawing, architectural drawing, blueprint reading, woodworking, printing, and auto mechanics.

Mr. J. M. Seaton and Mr. Ed Hoover teach mechanical and architectural drawing. The student learns the basic fundamentals of mechanical and architectural drafting.

Mr. Ed Hoover teaches wood shop. The student learns the basic theory necessary for the handling of the tools and mechanics of woodworking.

Mr. R. S. Wharton teaches printing. The student learns to set type and to operate the presses and other equipment.

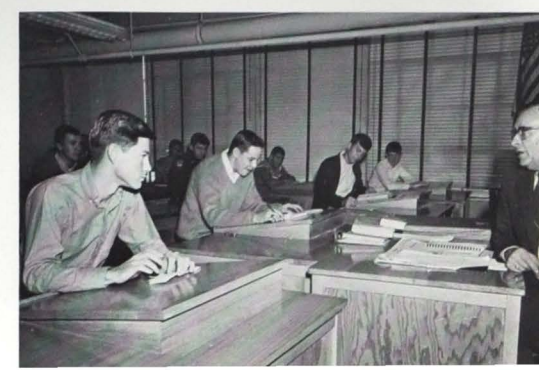
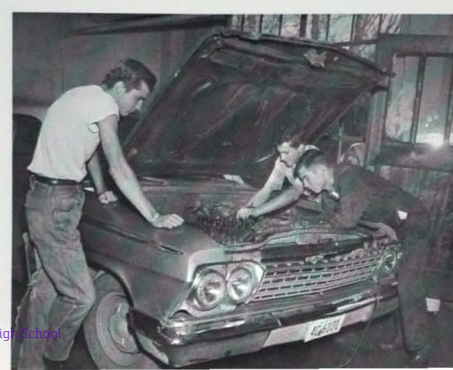
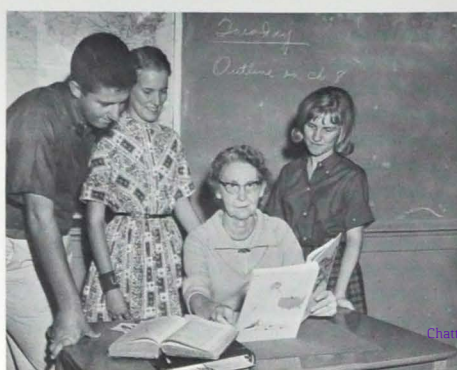
Mr. J. J. Fletcher teaches auto mechanics. The student learns to use the tools and to repair the different units of the automobile.

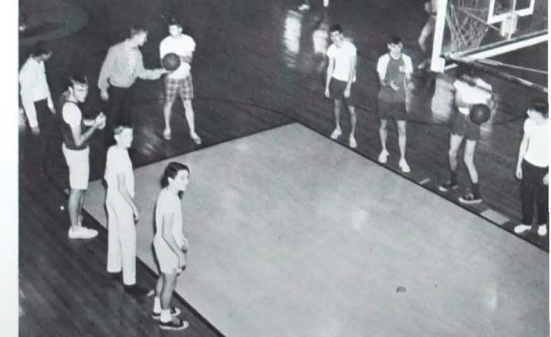
The student may obtain a major in any combination of industrial arts courses. This department gives the student an excellent chance to learn something of the process of industry.

Advanced Math Unified Geometry



The mathematics curriculum consists of those courses, units of instruction, and activities designed to contribute to the common and specialized mathematics needs of secondary school students. The curriculum places the proper amount of stress on developing (1) understanding, accuracy, and facility in the fundamental process of computation; (2) ability to use the problem-solving method in all situations; and (3) an understanding of the nature and structure of mathematics so that students can apply it to entirely new areas. The curriculum includes concepts and processes of modern mathematics upon which technical and scientific progress depends.

The curriculum provides for a sequential presentation of general and special mathematics contributing to present and future needs of students. Attention is given in learning activities to fundamental principles of mathematics and, at the same time, significant applications are made within the learner's range of understanding and interest.

Department of Physical Education

It is the objective of the boys' and girls' Physical Education Department to meet the needs of the individual in the fields of Physical Education, Health, and Recreation. It is the purpose that our students be surrounded by a wholesome and healthful environment and pervaded by the spirit of play and marked by joy and happiness.

To develop a spirit of competition and fair play so relative to the social structure of our great country is our aim.

Students will be directed in such a way that their activities, skills, and habits will carry through in later life.

The concepts of this department must be carried on vigorously by those who make up the department and to motivate leadership among those students who, in their physical and moral make-up, show signs of being leaders of men.

Music is the universal language of the world, understood by all people. Each person has his particular form of music that he prefers. We try to offer to the students of Central the opportunity of participating and listening to all these forms.

We have classes to meet all the students' needs. Three classes in vocal and six classes in instrumental music, from beginners to the advanced student.

Many programs, concerts and musicals, come from our advanced classes. We are called on to present many programs and concerts for out-of-school organizations.

We give our students the fundamental knowledge to further their education and pursue the form of music they desire. For those not wishing to pursue music as a vocation, our program will give them good basic training so that they might have music in some form for an avocation, from which will come many happy hours of participation.

The Science Department has made many changes this year in an attempt to keep abreast of the rapid progress being made in all phases of science. The most modern textbooks available to us were adopted for seventh, eighth, and ninth grade General Science classes and for Biology. In Physics the relatively new PSSC approach is being used, and in Chemistry the new Chemistry Study approach is in its second year.

The more advanced Freshmen have a choice between a special course in Biology and a new course, Physical Science, added this year.

A course in Photography completes the science curriculum.

Plans are in the making for instituting a new Advanced Biology course next year, which will incorporate not only more advanced material in Biology but also much Biochemistry, making, we feel, a well-rounded science curriculum.

Central Beats Soddy-Daisy 33-6 to Justify No. 1 Rank

Soddy-Daisy's Purple Pounders were down a gallant fight Friday night and received an affirmative answer to the question of whether they deserve the No. 1 ranking as the state's top schoolboy football team. It was the third consecutive triumph for the Purple Pounders and the fourth for Central. The victory raised Central's record to 10-0 and left the Trojans at 2-2 in league play. Central moved fast, taking the lead in the first quarter with a 33-yard drive, highlighted by a 20-yard pass to Shelley.



CENTRAL 20 SEVIERVILLE 0

September 3, 1965

Early in the second period, after Shelley's 71-yard drive, Lewis hurried over from the four and ran the point-after. On the second time around for the Pounders, Shelley moved 47 yards and hit Hudson to tally; Painter booted his first extra point of the season. In the fourth, Shelley ended a 44-yard drive with a 12-yard keeper, but Painter's kick failed.

CENTRAL 31 CITY 3

September 11, 1965

Immediately after the kick-off, Shelley marched 72 yards for a TD in eight plays. In the second period, Lewis carried for one score and Shelley jumped over for another. Hudson started off the second half with an 82-yard score, and Painter's kick was good. After City's 32-yard field goal, Lewis burst four yards for the last six-pointer.

CENTRAL 33 SODDY DAISY 6

September 24, 1965

Nine plays into the game Shelley sneaked over and Lewis ran the extra point. Adams ran up another score, but the

extra point was blocked. In the third period, Lewis burst 34 yards for one TD, Shelley ran another and Slatten made the extra point. After a Soddy Daisy sixer, Shelley and Lewis combined for seven.

CENTRAL 13 BRADLEY 12

October 1, 1965

After a goal-line stand, the Pounders drove to the Bears' 44, where Lewis broke through for the first score; Chapman kicked the extra point. Bradley scored twice in the third quarter, missed the PATs. Shelley saved the day with a quick hop, but only after a long drive, and the extra point failed.

CENTRAL 34 BRAINERD 0

October 8, 1965

The Purple defense and passing game pounced back after a rough time against Bradley. The first half saw two Lewis TDs, a scoring pass from Shelley to Hudson, and three Painter points-after without a single Brainerd first down. The second half was all Shelley, on the scoring end, with touchdown passes to Hudson and Willmon. A Painter extra point brought it to an even 34.

CENTRAL 29 RED BANK 7

October 15, 1965

Six plays into the game, Shelley dashed across for the first score, but the Lions came back with seven points. Lewis strode across, to show that it was nothing to worry about, and Painter kicked the PAT. In the second half, Shelley ran one TD and passed to Hudson for another; Painter made both extras. A safety ended it all.

CENTRAL 6 GAINESVILLE, FLA. 7

October 22, 1965

Let it never be said that Central has to win for a game to be good; this was a good game, and a close one. The Hurricanes got their seven points first, but a Shelley run made it up. Painter's conversion try was blocked and, although there was much running back and forth, no one else scored.

CENTRAL 21 EAST RIDGE 7

October 29, 1965

Lewis scored late in the first quarter and Painter made the PAT, as he made the other two for Central. East Ridge came back with seven points. In the second half, Adams took

a Shelley pass for one TD, and Slatten flew 41 yards for another.

CENTRAL 14 KNOX CENTRAL 7

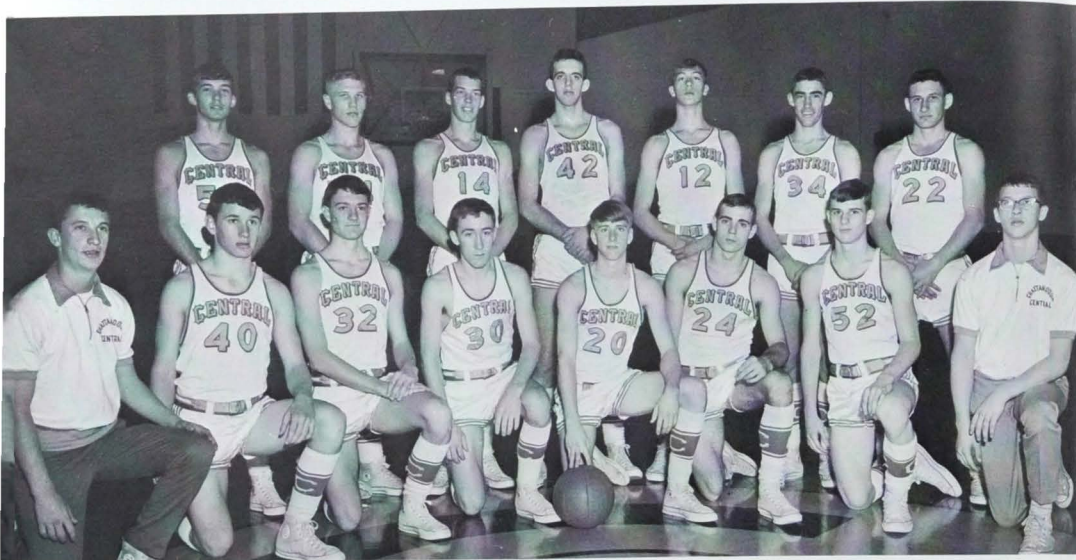
November 5, 1965

After a number of Lewis runs, Shelley tossed to Adams, who ran 23 yards for a TD; Painter made both PATs in the game. Later, Lewis carried one yard for the second tally. Knox Central made seven points and tried for more but failed; the Purple Pounders had their eighth victory of the season.

CENTRAL 41 NOTRE DAME 6

November 13, 1965

Shelley passed to Hudson for one, and to Adams for another score to make the score 14-0, counting Painter's two PATs. Shelley ended the first half with a pass to Hudson for another seven, and Painter made it again. Hudson took another Shelley toss over in the third quarter. The fourth quarter brought an Irish touchdown, seven points by Croft and seven points by Lewis; Painter assisted both Pounders. This victory was the widest of the season, and it captured the State championship for the Central Purple Pounders.

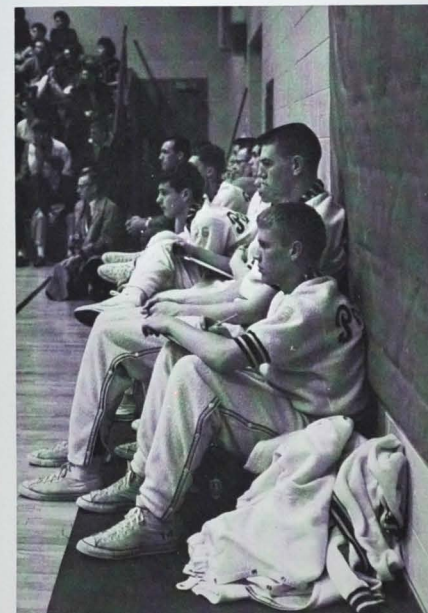

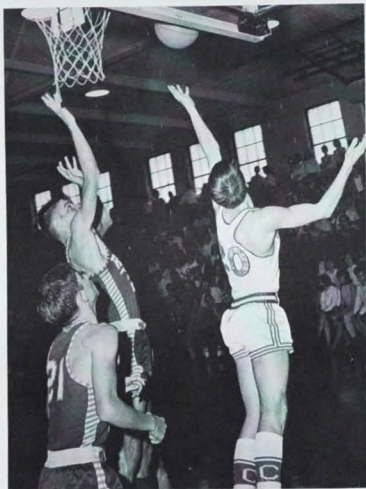
Tense moments

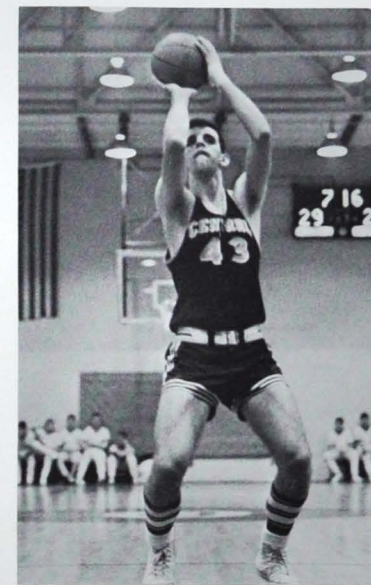

The summer ball was more rewarding, as the Pounders were runners-up in the American Legion League and undefeated in the Optimist League. To add to the summer glories Denny Painter pitched a no-hitter, and Freddy Dukes pitched a no-hitter and a perfect game.

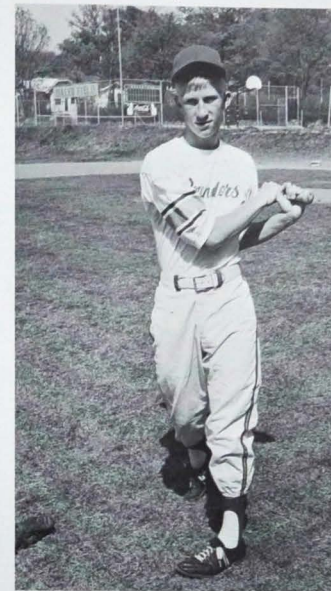
