



MISS ETHEL YORK


Department of English



Department of Guidance

Guidance is an organized program through which we help boys and girls understand and use their potentialities. Counselors are willing to assist students with problems related to choices of curriculum, academic progress, and college or career planning, as well as personal problems which may affect the student's adjustment. Mrs. Okrasinski is the director of the program at Central, with Mr. Wood assisting. Guidance services focus upon individual pupils and are designed to aid students in their learning about the complex and changing world of opportunity.

Department of Home Economics

This department deals with problems of the entire family—physical, social, material, and emotional. Consideration is given to individual problems such as dieting, personal grooming, and proper styling of clothes and hair. Laboratory skills are developed and add to the self-confidence of the individual. The basic objective of home economics is to raise the standards of living in our homes. This purpose is provided by a program of studies which includes budgeting, planning, and preparation of nutritious and balanced meals, and an understanding of the necessity for personal hygiene and home sanitation.

Department of Industrial Arts

The Industrial Arts Department includes: mechanical drawing; architectural drawing; blueprint reading; woodworking; printing; and auto mechanics. In architectural drawing one learns the basic fundamentals of mechanical and architectural drafting. Wood shop teaches him the basic theory necessary for the handling of tools and mechanics of woodworking. In printing one learns to set type and to operate the presses and other equipment, and auto mechanics teaches him to use the tools and to repair the different units of the automobile. 
Department of Foreign Languages





Chapin Library

The E. Y. Chapin Library, the largest and only endowed public library in Tennessee, consists of approximately 19,000 volumes. Its major purpose is to serve the aims of the total educational program by (1) providing a rich variety of books and audio-visual materials; (2) offering leadership in developing techniques for their use; (3) making available facilities, services, and equipment for the selection and use of instructional materials. Two librarians and twenty student assistants take pride in their library and in their service to their school.

Department of Mathematics

The curriculum places the proper amount of stress on developing (1) understanding, accuracy, and facility in the fundamental process of computation; (2) ability to use the problem-solving method; and (3) an understanding of the nature and structure of mathematics so that students can apply it to entirely new areas. The curriculum includes concepts and processes of modern mathematics upon which technical and scientific progress depends. Attention is given in learning activities to fundamental principles of mathematics and significant applications are made within the learner's range of understanding and interest.




Department of Music



You hear the news and drop whatever you're doing and you cover your face with both hands to blot out the image. Mike Perkins is dead! Mike Perkins full of life, full of purpose, full of a mysterious fear that he couldn't do enough. Mike Perkins is dead!


And so we wonder. We look to the doctors and the coaches and we wonder about the causes and they shake their heads, for they cannot answer. CENTRAL VS. BAYLOR



CENTRAL VS. KIRKMAN



CENTRAL VS. BRAINERD



The men who received the title of Times All-City were Choate, Leonard, Matlock, and Painter, and All-Tournament winners chosen by area sports writers


