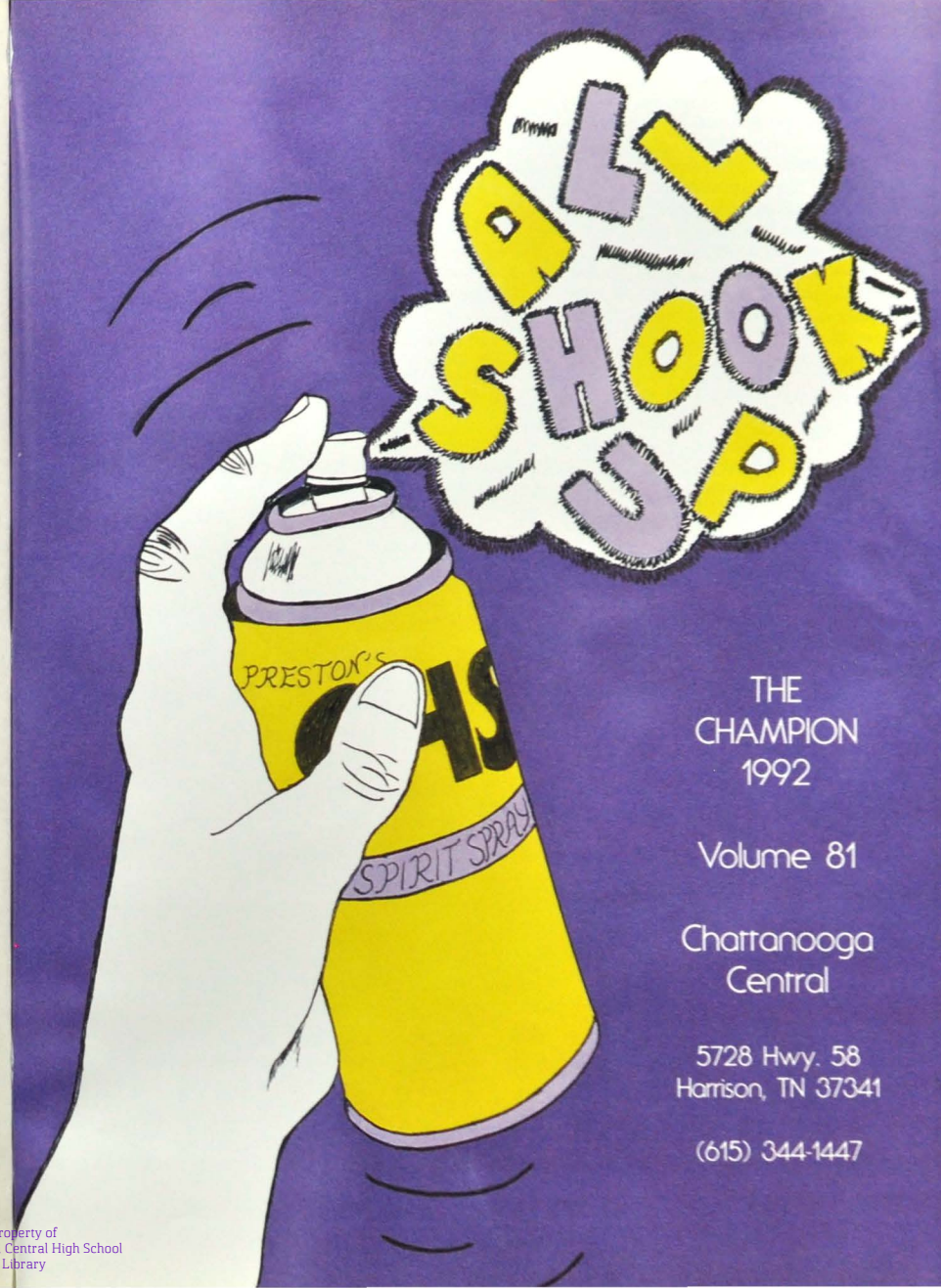

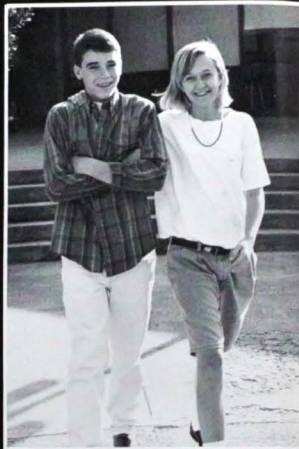
What is it like among the confusion? Just plain CRAZY!
