



In the end, the Seniors lead the underclassmen, setting examples, and in turn train them to be future leaders and to represent Central High School to the fullest.*






SENIORS SHAPE THE SCHOOL WITH PRIDE

A PLACE, A SCHOOL, A TIME TO REMEMBER

The place, Dodds Avenue, the year, 1907, and the school, Central High. In 85 years this school has had a history of changes. From the diversity of students to the moving of the school building, the school has grown in beauty and in character. In Central's 85 years we have had seven principals with the first being Mr. A.E. Darrah and the greatest of them all our current principal, Mr. Charles H. Preston.

In September of 1907 Central opened its doors to 269 students. The senior class graduated 19 students. Since then one of the largest graduating classes consisted of over 400 seniors. Central has at one time held close to 1300 students and this year has 1083 with over 200 seniors.

There have been many glorious moments in Central's history, with eleven state championships in sports. Central has been chosen as one of the top seven schools in Tennessee. In 1987 the school was named a National School of Excellence. We have the National Bellamy Award, the Freedoms Foundation Award and the Scenic Beautification Award. Our seniors

have been presidential scholars as well as National Merit scholarship winners.

Some people wonder if we have always been called the Purple Pounders. The answer is no. For 32 years we were know as the Purple Warriors until in 1939 when the football team seemingly pounded out the yardage. There were repeatedly called the pounders by local sports writers and eventually the school mascot was changed to the Purple Pounders.

























SPIRIT WEEK
