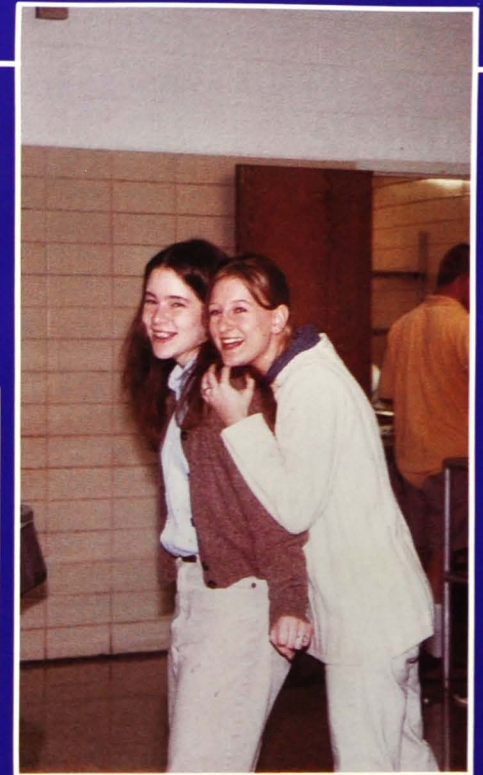
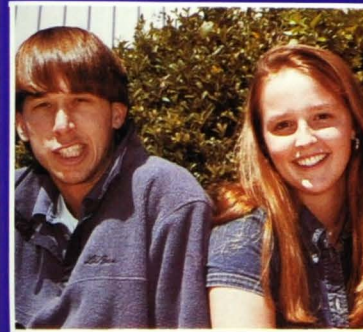

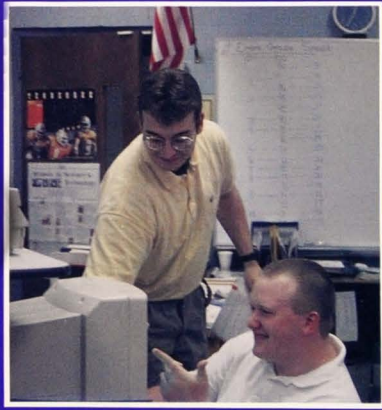
"Prime Time" at Central High

Maggie Dake, Holly Walraven, Jennifer Ivey, and Crystal Berens were 4 of the 12 girls who played varsity soccer, and Marshall Meers and Rex Henry were 2 of the 5 who played boys soccer. Randall Mitchell ran track while Tina Coyner and Jamie Dye were two of our star volleyball players.

Other early achievements included the selection of Jeremy Ames, Sacha Feathers, and Michael Wellman to represent our school in the Academic Olympics. David Rievley, Casey Boblewski, Allan Streetman, and Kathryn Stanfield represented Central in the All-State Band, and Terri Wheeler was voted Best All-Around freshman. We had five out of our class to participate in Student Council. Luke Shipley and Amy Aldridge were chosen by Tri-Hi-Y as the Mr. and Miss November calendar couple, and Mikie Lowe and Terri Wheeler as Mr. and Miss December. As the '93-'94 school year came to a close, we were relieved that we would no longer be the babies of the school.

We started our second year with much more spirit and enthusiasm. Haven Howell was re-elected president, Tiffany Gee became our new vice president, Terri Wheeler served as the secretary again, and Amy Aldridge was voted treasurer. With the joint effort of the class officers and the sophomore class, we beat the freshman, juniors, and seniors in the Homecoming pole-decorating contest. Three out of our 10th grade class made it into Tri-Hi-Y, and three were initiated into Y-Teens.

In sports, 10 sophomores participated in varsity football with 4 tenth-grade varsity cheerleaders to pep them up. Sean Krum and John Robinson were two of the four out of our class to play golf, and Kevin Pearson, Josh Hawkesworth, and Paul Massengill were three new additions to our varsity basketball team. Josh Denham, Marshall Meers, Brent Humphreys, and Bryan Wood all wrestled varsity. Our baseball team was exceptional with four sophomores and our softball team with two. As our sophomore year came to an end, Marshall Meers was voted Best All-Around.

Another page is turned in the scrapbook, and once again, we chose the leaders of our class. Amy Aldridge was voted class president, Tiffany Gee was re-elected vice president, Marshall Meers became our secretary, and Jenny Cox was elected as our treasurer. Our delegates to Boys' State were Jeremy Ames & Aaron Daniel, and John Donahoo and Jason Demastus were the alternates. Girls' State delegates included Kerry Robinson and Kylie Pitts, while Jamie Dye and Chara Crowley were alternates. Our strength in academics was shown through the 12 members in National Honor Society and the 14 members of Beta Club. There were thirty juniors in Mrs. Stone and Mrs. Robbs' American Studies class that traveled to Virginia, Rhode Island, Boston, and New York. The Art Club had five members, and the Leadership class took nine students out of the junior class. We had ten juniors in football, four in cheerleading, and seven who played varsity baseball. Anthony Reviere and Terrance Woods ran track while Nathan Strait and Stephen Hales played tennis. Another successful year came to a close, and we elected Marshall Meers as Best All-Around junior.

As I turned to the last pages in the scrapbook of our high school years, I realized just how much we had all accomplished. We all eagerly awaited May 31, our graduation day, as we started our unforgettable senior year. We made many new friends such as Jose Olivera, one of our exchange students from Uruguay, who was loved by everyone. 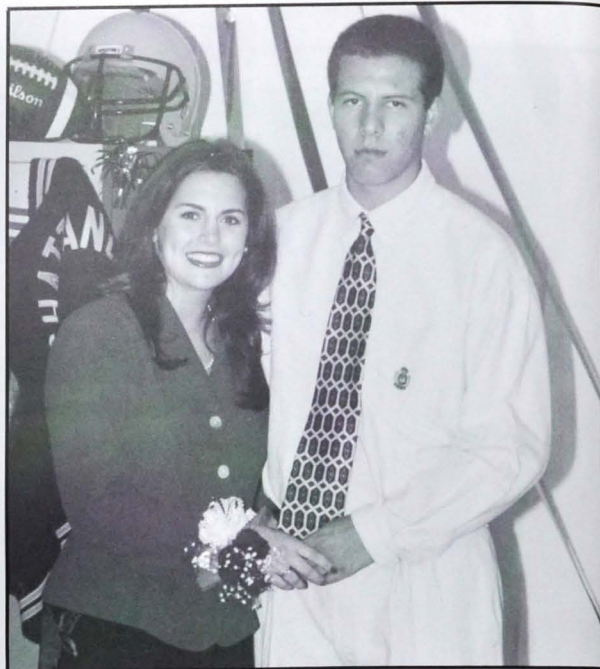
CLUBS AND DANCES

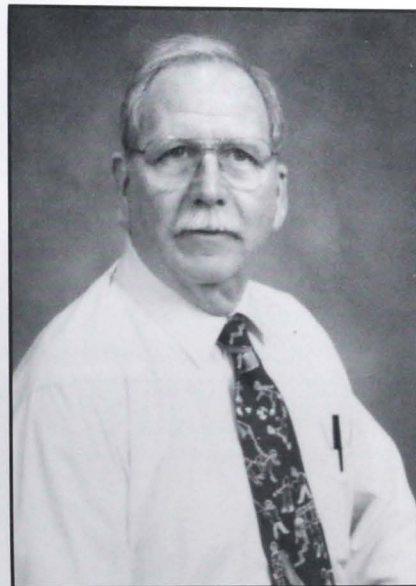


MR. JACK MONROE

Thirty years of her life went to teaching; now it is time to put her home and garden at the top of the list. She would also like to do some traveling and see parts of the world she hasn't seen yet.

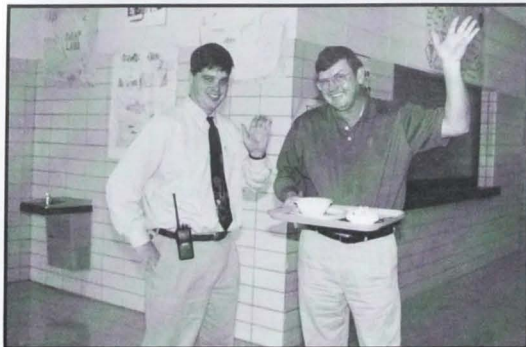
