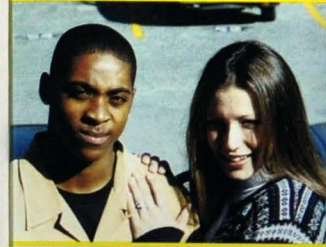
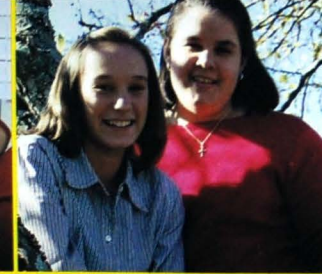
# To the Class of 2000...

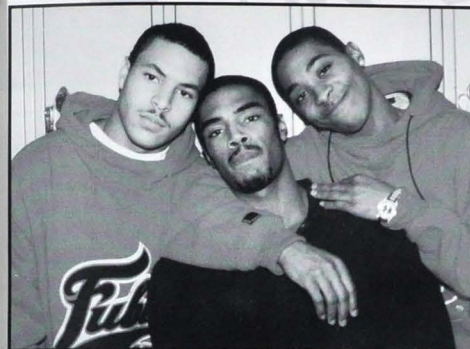
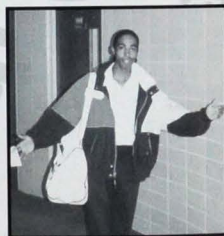
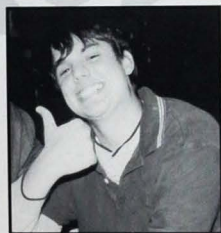
## In The Beginning ...

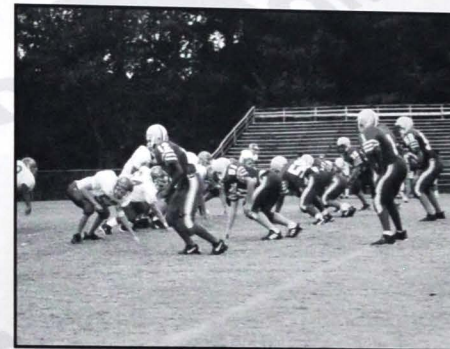

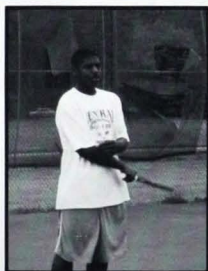
