The President's arrival at the Roundhouse was greeted by a standing ovation, wild cheering and bands playing spirited songs.



Brocks And Teachers

More than 20 years ago, Mr. Bill Brock and his wife, the late Laura Handly "Muffet" Brock, established the Hand Foundation here to support education in the Chattanooga area. When Mrs. Brock died in December 1986 after a short bout with cancer, however, he and his four children tried to think of something special that would be an appropriate memorial to a lady known for her special touch in dealing with others.

"We felt education was the right thing. It's the one she would have chosen, and it's so important an area," said Mr. Brock. The family also decided they wanted something that would reflect the values that were such a strong part of Mrs. Brock's

The Brocks came up with an award that would recognize these traits in area teachers while strengthening teachers, students, and the entire school system.

Students in each school would vote for the teacher who they felt made them realize their own potential, and the highest votegetter would receive a check for \$5,000. The second highest vote-getter would receive \$1,000, and the third highest vote-getter would receive \$500. "Students are the only ones who can answer this question."

"I recognize that this is a value judgment — It's not measurable numerically. But values are the most important thing we teach. I think that's what Muffet was all about. The hope is that by recognizing teachers with these kinds of qualities, you will encourage others to do the same. And we can make this school system as good as it can be and as caring as you can find anywhere."
