THE HISTORY OF THE CLASS OF 1995

As we reflected on the memories of our first year at Central, we breathed sighs of relief that we no longer were regarded as the babies.

To prove this, we began our second year with even more spirit and hope than our first. We developed friendships that hoped would endure throughout our lives. 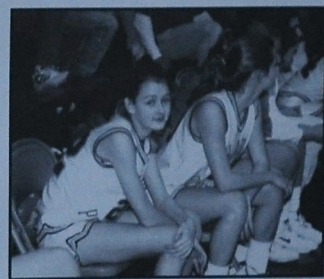

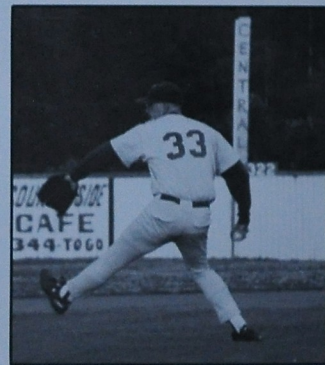
