The human mind is our fundamental resource. A balanced Federal program must go well beyond incentives for investment in plant and equipment. It must include equally determined measures to invest in human beings -- both in their basic education and training and in their more advanced preparation for professional work. Without such measures, the Federal Government will not be carrying out its responsibilities for expanding the base of our economic and military strength."

A PROCLAMATION BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA
ON EDUCATION WEEK, 1962

"The education of our people should be a lifelong process by which we continue to feed new vigor into the lifeblood of the nation through intelligent, reasoned, decisions. Let us not think of education only in terms of the facts, but rather in terms of the infinite potential of the human mind that can be realized through education. Let us think of education as a means of developing our greatest abilities, because in each of us there is a private hope and dream which, fulfilled, can be translated into benefit for everyone and greater strength for our nation."

The Spirit of Central High School

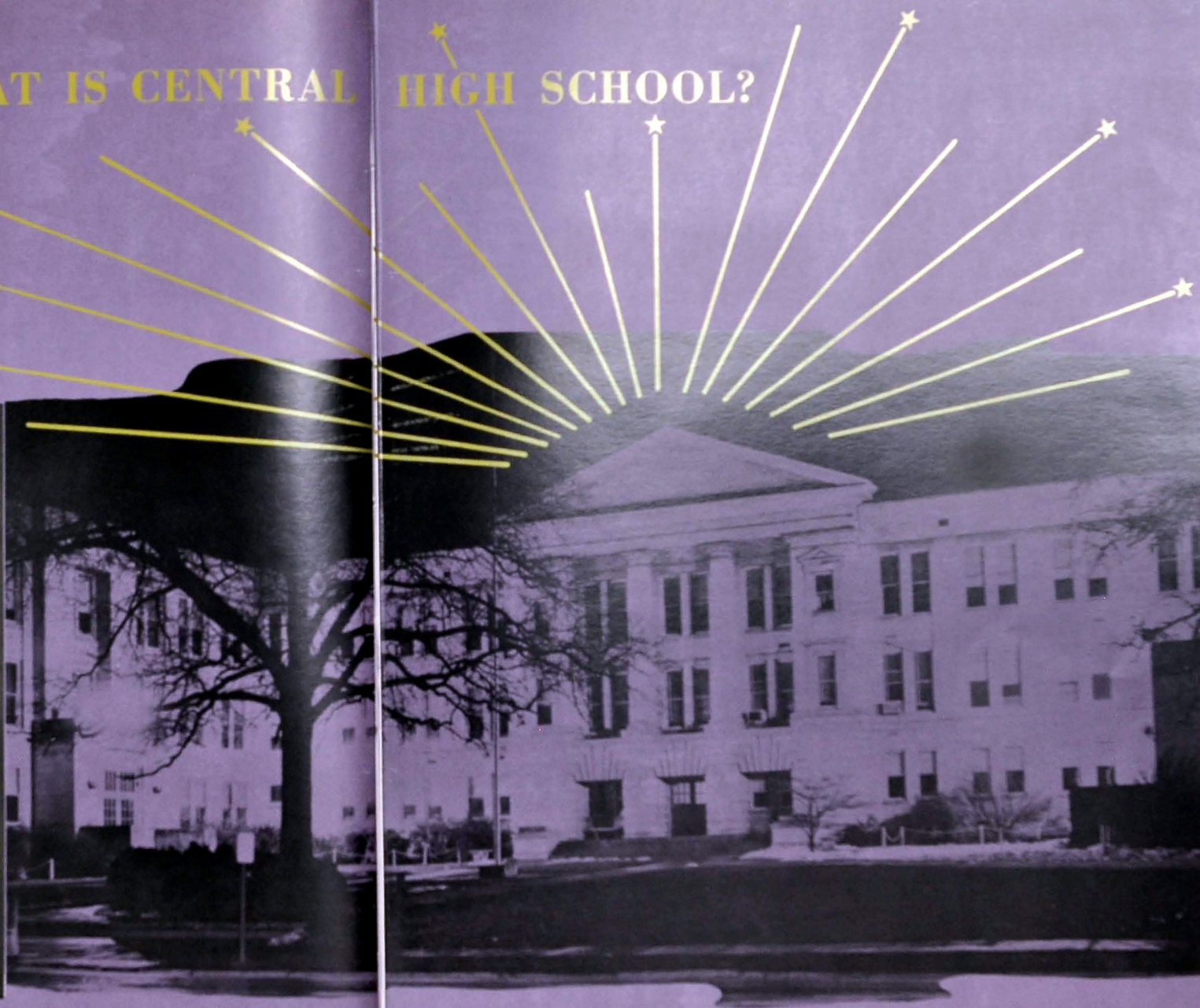
By day, Central High School looms in the mist and the sun and has a soul. From the mountains and the valleys gather students who mingle together in the corridors.

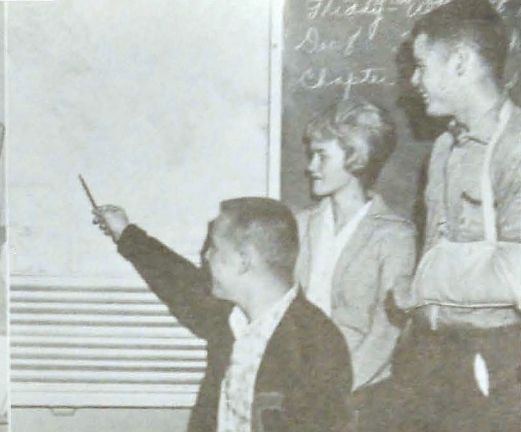
Business Education

The Business Education Department has designed its program to meet the needs of all students.

For those who plan to secure a vocational competence, excellent training is offered for secretarial, bookkeeping, clerical, or stenographic positions.

For those who plan to go to college, courses are included which give valuable basic training for their work there.

Lastly, for all students, the department provides a nonvocational education which creates an appreciation and understanding of the business world.



Art

The aim of the art department is to develop visual literacy. We mean by this to train the pupil to be aware of what he sees in terms of light, dark, color, line, shape, form, and texture. The Art Department strides to develop this awareness not only in painting and sculpturing, but also in landscaping architecture, and in everything else that lies before the eye.



Music

Our Music Department is one of the best, with opportunities for all in almost any field of music in which we wish to participate. By participating, we broaden ourselves and learn to distinguish that which is good and at the same time study music that will enrich our future.



Speech

The Speech Department offers beginning speech and dramatics to all students, grades nine through twelve.

The aim of the program is to help students to develop competency in participation of school activities and community.

This department is responsible for the production of school plays, the presentation of speeches on Senior Day, Class Day, and Commencement.

Guidance

The Guidance Department is the newest department at Central High School. It was set up to aid students at Central while they are in school and prepare them for their role in society after graduation. The guidance program is designed to properly place students in areas for which they are best qualified and in which their interests lie. The department provides students with occupational information so as to make them aware of subjects needed in order to meet job requirements. Information concerning colleges and other higher institutions of learning is made available to those students who are interested. Counselors are willing to assist students with all school problems. Mr. Hale is the director of the program; and Miss Hodges, Mr. Brown and Mr. Hoodenpyl serve as counselors.

History

The History Department, led by Mrs. Alfred Skates, offers a number of courses in order to improve the quality of citizenship and to help students understand national and world problems.

Tennessee history is taught in the seventh grade, and United States history is taught in the eighth grade. Bible is offered in grades nine through twelve. World history is open to sophomore, junior, and senior students; and American history is required in the senior year.

Home Economics

Students in the Home Economics Department get acquainted with the problems met by the entire family: physical, social, material, and emotional.

Consideration of individual problems such as reducing diets, personal grooming, and proper styling of clothes, adds to the self confidence of the individual.

One of the basic objectives of home economics is to raise the standards of home living. This purpose is provided by a program which includes budgeting, management, child care, clothing, planning, and preparation for nutritious and balanced meals.



Industrial Arts

The Industrial Arts Department is led by Mr. J. J. Fletcher. This department includes mechanical drawing, woodworking, printing, and auto mechanics with a major offered in each. The purpose of this department is to give students knowledge and guidance in practical skills useful for future occupations. This year there are three hundred and fifteen students enrolled in these useful courses.



Mathematics

The mathematics curriculum consists of those courses, activities, and units of instruction designed to contribute to the common and specialized mathematics needs of secondary-school pupils. The curriculum places particular stress on developing accuracy and facility in the use of computational processes in practical situations. Provisions are made for pupils to develop skills and abilities in the mathematics areas of geometry, graphic representation and interpretation, elementary analysis, and scientific thinking.



Science

The Science Department is composed of seven instructors with J. Arlie Hoodenpyl as head. Within the department there is a composite of one hundred and two years of teaching experience. Included in the department are general science, biology, chemistry, physics, and photography. During the present school year there are eight hundred and fifty students enrolled within this department, whose purpose is to instruct the students in scientific knowledge and its practical application.



Social Science

The chief purpose of education is to train every student to become the best citizen he is capable of being. The social science subjects have the above purpose. They cannot achieve this aim entirely; they contribute to the achievement of it. Civics, economics, sociology, and psychology are comparatively new subjects in the curriculum. They are enriching subjects. They seek to acquaint the student with his background and environment and to contribute to his maximum usefulness in our society.



Languages

FOREIGN LANGUAGE

In our Foreign Language Department we are trying to develop facility in reading and writing the language, together with a more realistic approach to understanding and speaking the language.

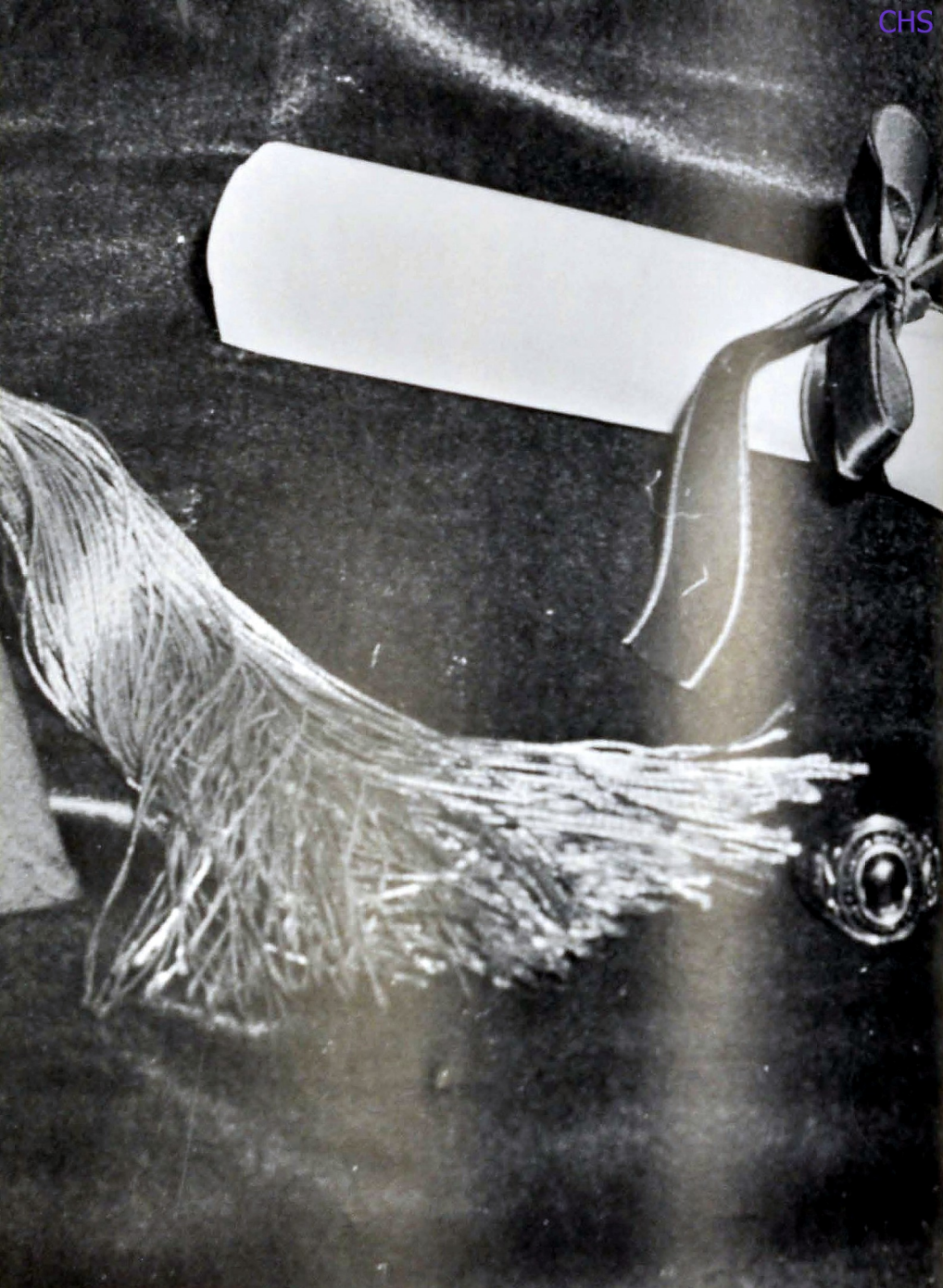
To achieve the latter, the role of the language laboratory in the instructional program looms increasingly important since it provides regular practice in listening and repeating the foreign language as presented by educated native speakers.

Listening practice is intended to lead to the ability to understand the spoken language and the acquisition of a language laboratory should be of real value in attaining this goal, not to mention its value as a means of motivating the student in his language efforts.

ENGLISH

The English Department is composed of twelve instructors who have the task of motivating students to think. In the study of grammar and composition, we strive to teach students more effective ways in which to express their thoughts, and in the study of literature we strive to enrich the lives of students by introducing them to the masterpieces of literature; to make the literary experiences meaningful to them; to enhance reading skills; and to stimulate vocabulary growth.

The Reserve Officers Training Corps of Central High School was organized on December 29, 1919 when an order to establish such units in Chattanooga high schools was issued by the Secretary of the Army and signed by the Adjutant General and the Chief of Staff.

This unit is now in its forty-third year of operation and has proved to be an important factor in discipline and behavior throughout its long history.

The military department offers three years of study, two of which are required. Classes are conducted on leadership, drill and command, map reading, care and cleaning of weapons and equipment, small unit tactics, and other subjects related to the history and organization of the Army. Teaching these classes is a staff of instructors consisting of Sgt. Brasher, M/Sgt. Lochrane, and SFC's Shelton, Shields and Sizemore. SFC Gilbert is the non-commissioned officer in charge of the department, and M/Sgt. Hammonds is the Administrative NCO.

This year a new attraction was added to the department in the field of tactical training—a mock battle was staged between Central and Chattanooga High School, and blank ammunition was issued to those chosen to participate.

CLARKSVILLE 7

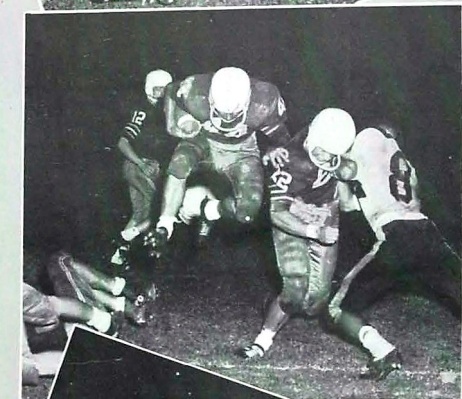
