
Jim Stratigos Represents Central at National Bellamy Award Presentation

A strong offensive line helped give Central the passing it needed to balance its good rushing offense.






Exciting football and loyal fan support characterized a season which was brought to a close with the Civic Bowl game in Tullahoma.





Central started the '69 season by downing Memphis White Station 29-14. Henry Radford, Jim Hunt, T. L. Young, and Steve Sterchi each scored once as the Pounders unweiled a balanced offense. Meanwhile, the Pounder defense, led by Underhill, Downs, and Few, limited White Station to two touchdowns.

Central 29 City 6

After two years of one point victories the Pounders buried arch-rival City 29-6. Quarterback Randy Goins found receiver Johnny Turner with touchdown passes of 5 and 13 yards, while fullback Henry Radford scored twice in gaining over 100 yards for the second straight game. Defensively the Pounders held City until the fourth quarter with outstanding work from Underhill, Downs, McHarge, and Cagle.

Central 20 Riverside 0


Mike Cagle starred both offensively and defensively as Central shut out Riverside 20-0. The 145-pound senior gained 62 yards in three carries, and intercepted two Trojan aerials and scored twice. Jim Hunt had the other touchdown, as the Trojans were keying on fullback Radford. Stone, Barclay, Carroll, and Mc-Harge were star Pounder defenders.

Central 38 Howard 6

Central's defense held Howard to a mere 13 yards total offense as the Pounders clouted the Tigers 38-6. Jim Hunt scored three touchdowns as Central capitalized on Howard's mistakes. Henry Radford and Johnny Turner added a touchdown each. Howard's score came in the fourth quarter on a fumble recovery which was returned 78 yards.

Red Bank 28

Red Bank used two long runs to upset Central for the second straight year, 28-20. Tom Patrick returned a kick-off 89 yards and Sam Gortney took a pass interception 65 yards for the Lion tallies. Henry Radford punched in for two touchdowns and Jim Hunt scored once for Central.

Central 38

Bradley County 20

Henry Radford paced the Pounders with 196 yards and three touchdowns as Central walloped Bradley County 38-20. Jim Hunt, T. L. Young, and Johnny Turner each added 6 points in an offensive display, Turner's coming on a 71 yard punt return. Downs, Houts, Sterchi, Stone, and Underhill were defensive standouts for the Pounders.

Central 7

East Ridge 0

Central slipped by East Ridge 7-0 in a rain-soaked Homecoming contest. Following a fumble recovery by Bob Few, T. L. Young posted the game's only score on a pass from Randy Goins. Both teams were troubled by turnovers on the muddy field.

Central 18

Kirkman 12

Central turned back a surprising Kirkman team 18-12 by fine defensive play. Jim Hunt scored first on a 2-yard plunge. Central increased this lead to 12-0 as Alan Houts rambled 36 yards with a fumble recovery. After a Hawk score, Randy Goins found Johnny Turner for the final Pounder touchdown and a 18-6 lead. Defensive play paced by Houts, Gulas, Underhill, and Carroll stood out as Central held Kirkman to one more touchdown and an 18-12 victory.

Central 37

Notre Dame 0

Central defeated Notre Dame on a freezing night as the Pounders clobbered the Irish 37-0. Mike Cagle intercepted 4 passes and scored twice as Radford scored once and gained enough yardage to total over 1000 yards for the season. Two more touchdowns were posted while Lewis Williams went 20 yards to close the scoring. The Pounder defense led by Cagle, Gulas, Stewart, and Underhill held on to shut out the Irish.

Madison 7

Brilliant defenses by both teams brought about a score of 7-6 as Central lost to Madison in the Civic Bowl at Tullahoma. The Pounders scored first with Cagle going 13 yards and the extra point failing. Madison scored in the second quarter after a Pounder fumble. The game went on to be the defensive slugfest as a Pounder field goal went awry with seconds left in the game.







E. B. "Red" Etter Leaves Central After Twenty-eight Years of Coaching



On February 19, 1970, the Central High School faculty and students made their farewells to Coach E. B. "Red" Etter. He resigned after 28 years of teaching and coaching to accept a position at Baylor as athletic director.

While head football coach at Central, Coach Etter compiled a record matched by few coaches anywhere. In 27 years as head coach his teams won over 200 games while never suffering a losing season. He also served Central well in the classroom by teaching several


varied courses such as Latin and applied math.

Through his coaching and teaching Coach Etter helped hundreds of young people to prepare for the future. These people, at Central now and those who have already graduated, will remember Coach Etter as a driving force behind the Central Spirit.




Basketball Team Compiles 5-18 Record in Modern Gymnasium












Coach Jack Archer Attains Position of Head Football Coach

Coach Archer's most recent position for service came this year when he was selected to replace E. B.




Miss Mary Ellen Rice served as Head of the Foreign Language
