Senior Class History

At the crack of the ring-master's whip three hundred and thirty-five trained performers moved into the fourth ring of the Central arena.

This group included the following list of performers prominent in the school life of Central of 1930 and '31: Football stars and steady players, who made brilliant touchdowns and valiantly guarded Central's goal, as Vernon Headrick, captain; Leon Chilcutt, Claude Gist, French McClanahan; quick-witted pen-pushers as Myra Graham, editor of "The Champion"; Bertha Evans, editor of the "Digest"; basketball and baseball players and track boys, who fought hard and successfully for Central; silver-tongued speech-makers as Violet Proper, Paul Stringer, and Myra Graham; capable financiers as Robert Mann, Arthur Westbrook and Garlan Tyrrell, of the two school publications; men with military minds as Ray Ruggles and Homer Holly; song-birds as Dot Lee, Lydia Davis, Barbara Bush, D. M. Raulston, Harold Harris, Leslie Lacro; clever mimics and actors as Lydia Davis, Herman Davis, Bessie Snodgrass, Hiram Tripp and D. M. Raulston; efficient candy salesmen as Vernon Headrick, Oscar Sutton and Howard Porter, the prominent performers in the life of Central are efficient workers of the Commercial Department, the Bank and Book Store forces. The following people have rendered invaluable service through their faithful work in this line: Margaret Luther, Elsie Lowry, Dot Adams, Harry Corfizon, Mary Frances Bouldin, Della Mae Maupin, Dot Carney, Bobbie Neuhauser, Ruth Rawlings, and Angie Rawlings.

As these people looked at the panorama about them, they recalled the days when they had been in the three rings that had preceded their present position. They remembered how as "green" freshmen, starting as beginners in the "Big Top," they had selected four marshals to help Mr. Nelson, the master trainer, in making the performance a success. These marshals were Bill Waller, president; Brown Blakely, vice-president; Ida W. Mabry, secretary, and Corrine Mayer, treasurer.

The first of Central's outstanding performances of that year was the City-Central game as a "grande finale" of the football season. It was that year that we won the city championship and a beautiful silver football trophy. At that stirring City-Central game, the freshmen, having caught the Central spirit and enthusiasm, yelled as lustily as the seniors. They loyally supported the team with Vernon Headrick as their representative, who was the only freshman to become a letterman that year.

Then basketball, track and baseball seasons rolled around and vacation approached. As inexperienced freshmen we watched with envious eyes the experienced troopers during the commencement act, but forgot their pleasures and sorrows when we realized that we could stop training for three glorious months.

Then came September when we entered the Big Top, not as freshmen, but as "sophisticated sophs" of the second ring. We were drawing nearer the spotlights and the center ring. Bill Waller was re-elected assistant trainer with Robert Mann, Vernon Headrick, and Finley Bradford to aid him. During this year we increased our representation in athletics, in the Glee Club, orchestra and other organizations. The performance in this ring, although not of unusual brilliancy was fairly successful.

The third year we entered the lime-light with a burst of brilliance. With Bill Waller, Finley Bradford, Elizabeth Templeton and D. M. Raulston as budding trainers, we took our places in the "Jolly Junior" ring.

Central's football team, with the third ring well represented, came through with flying colors of Purple and Gold and won the city championship trophy for the third time since this class entered in '27.

Central, represented by a junior, Myra Graham, won first place in the state humorous contest at Knoxville.

"The Meanest Man in the World", starring Ruth Gross and Herman Davis, was presented as the annual junior play. This play, which was the first main act on the program for spring, was very successful.

The junior party followed and under the management of Elizabeth Templeton, Bill Waller and Frank McNeill was a decided success. Close upon its heels came the Junior-Senior Banquet which closed our performance as juniors of the sawdust ring.

Seniors! We paraded proudly before the awed spectators as the star performers of Central. Leading the parade was Robert Mann, class president, closely followed by Bill Waller, vice-president, and Elizabeth Templeton, secretary-treasurer.

The football season as a whole was successful, considering the fact that we had an inexperienced team to battle against the line-ups of our opponents.

Chattanooga High's victory in football was balanced by our victory in basketball. The success of our basketball teams of both boys and girls was remarkable. Harry King, Harold Bennett, Leon Chilcutt, Claude Gist and Victory Covey were the stars among the boys, while Margaret Timmons, Gladys Thornburg, Geneva Tate, Effie Wilson, Dean Gulnn and Maud Cunningham shared honors for the girls.

The Shakespearean comedy, "Twelfth Night", which was presented in December by the class, was a decided success. The leading roles were taken by Lydia Davis, Bessie Snodgrass, William McMahan, Hiram Tripp, D. M. Raulston and Herman Davis.

With the arrival of spring the seniors, as well as nature, had new life. We were beginning the last act of our performance at Central. And a jolly act it was, starting with a "Round-the-World Tour" as our senior party. Five countries were visited: the Orient, France, Spain, Italy, and the British Isles. In each of these lands there was special entertainment for the traveling Americans. The trip ended in the cafeteria where refreshments were served. The party was a grand success, due to the work of the committee composed of Robert Mann, Ruth Williamson, Elizabeth Templeton, Paul Stringer, and Ruth Wilbur.

Soon after the party the four-year honor students were announced, reminding us that the hard work and daily routine have their rewards. The honor students were: Myra Graham, Robert Mann, Roy Butler, Bertha Evans, Neva McClure, Ella Dalley, Helen Taylor, Glenn Tallant, Charlotte Stowe, Dorothy Carney, Marjorie Steffner, Mary McDonald, and Helen Pruett.

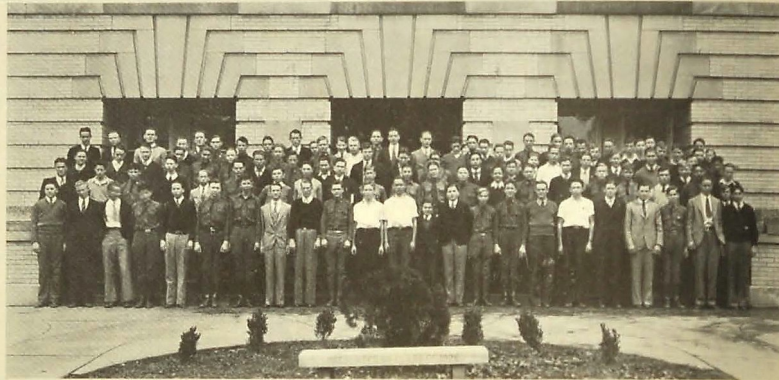

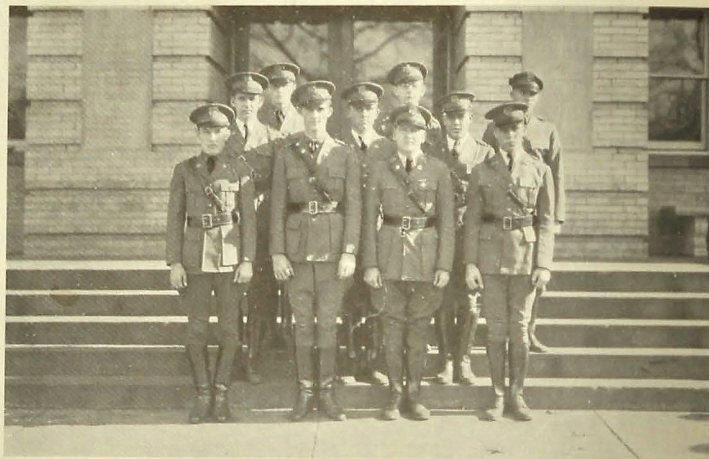
COLONEL JAMES E. WARE

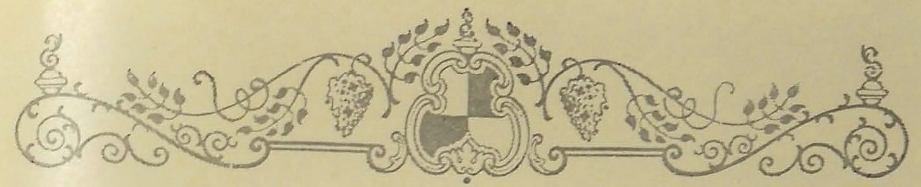
Baseball

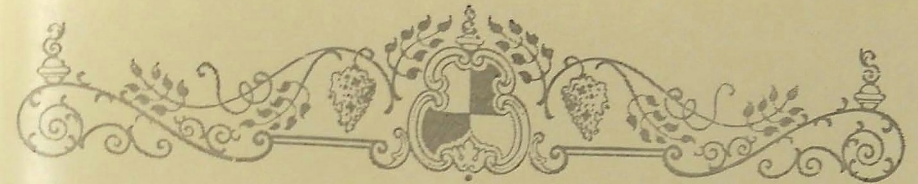


Superlatives

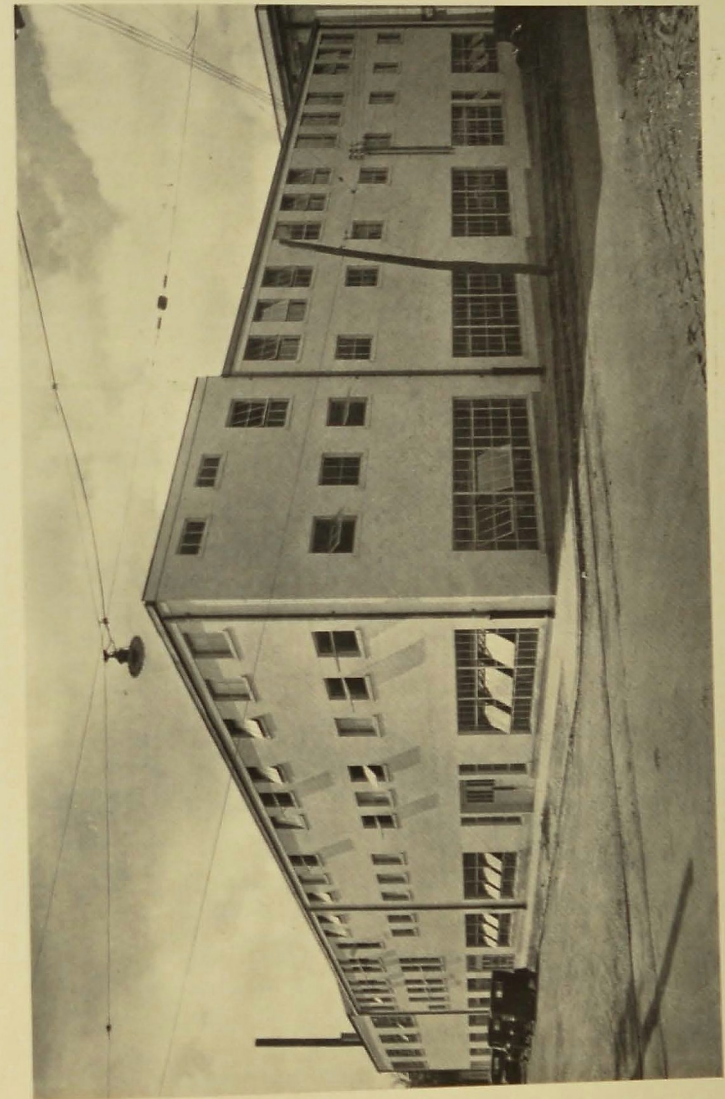
