There may be others who will be more prominent in the future, but as they have not come to the front yet, they have not been mentioned.



COLONEL JAMES E. WARE was Assistant Professor of Military Science and Tactics in the University of Georgia before coming to Central. His many experiences as an army man include service in the Philippine Insurrection in 1898; commander of the refuge camp after the San Francisco earthquake and fire disaster in 1906; service on the Mexican border, 1913-17; member of three hundred and sixth brigade at Varennes-en-Argonne; major of the regular army, 1920. He retired from the army in 1921 as a result of disability while in service.

SERGEANT HARRIS was chief clerk of the Chattanooga Recruiting District prior to his assignment at Central. He is an honor graduate of the N. C. O. School of the Twenty-ninth Infantry, Fort Benning, Georgia. He has been in the army twelve years, during which time he has been stationed in various parts of the United States, including California and the Mexican border. During his career in the army Sergeant Harris has had many interesting experiences in the Philippine Islands, and has spent three years with the American forces in China.
