From a small center building, at the date of the founding of the school in 1907, Central High School has grown to a rather impressive three story structure covering an entire block.

From a school in the beginning with a faculty of twentyfive members and a student body of 250, Central has increased in 1956, to a staff of seventy-eight and a student body numbering 2,050.

Along with its rapid physical growth there has been a great chlargement in number and variety of subjects taught, courses offered, and extra curricular activities available. The class rooms today number approximately sixty-four, many of which have additional facilities in laboratory and experimental material. Central's library is one of the largest high school libraries in the South with 15,509 volumes and an average monthly circulation of 5,971.

Originally the campus was enclosed by a hedge and boasted a number of oak trees, but Time, a grim reaper, has taken his toll, and today, between the front walk ways, stands one lone but beautiful oak, the joy and pride of the Central campus.

Coached by Red Etter, Stanley Farmer, Les Newton, Jake Seaton, W. L. Tate, and J. E. Hale, and captained by Paul Hutcheson and Bobby Baskette, the 1955 Purple Pounders rolled to a seven won, and three lost season record.

Now in his thirteenth year as head coach at Central, Red Etter started his coaching career at Fruitland Institute of Hendersonville, North Carolina, After coming to Central in 1942 as an assistant to Dean Petersen, Coach Etter was elevated to the head coaching job in 1943.

A member of the American Legion, Elks, and a Lieutenant Commander in the Naval Reserve, Coach Stanley Farmer has been coaching and teaching physical education at Central for nine years.

Since 1941, Lester Newton has coached Central football players, Aside from helping boys develop on the gridiron, Coach Newton serves as Knothole Director of Rookie Baseball.

Having developed a deep interest in coaching while attending East Tennessee State Teachers College, Coach Jake Seaton began his coaching career at Soddy Daisy High School, working principally with the B Team. He has been a member of the Purple Pounder Staff for the past ten years.

One of Central's first year coaches is W. L. Tate. After captaining the 1949 Central football team and lettering four years at Western Kentucky, Coach Tate returned this year to Central as assistant coach and teacher of science.

The other first year Pounder coach is J. E. Hale. After graduating from Central in 1951, Coach Hale attended Western Kentucky for two years and then finished his college work at the University of Chattanooga. This is also Mr. Hale's first year as a teacher of history.

This 1955 Pounder Football squad had its ups and downs. However, the season had its bright spots as well as dark moments. After two victories, Columbia 27-7 and Southside 13-7, the Pounders fell to Memphis Central 12-6. A 42-6 victory over Portland High was the next Pounder game; then the Purples were beaten by the Kingsport Indians 20-12, in the mud at Kingsport, The previously undefeated Bradley Bears were overwhelmed by Central 26-7. Louisville Flaget was then defeated by the Pounder Machine, 20-0.

Columbus Jordan, Homecoming Game foe, was beaten 26-0 before the Pounders lost to Baylor, 18-7. In the Meninak Bowl Game, Central finished their season with a smashing 35-13 victory over Jacksonville Landon.

Some of the highlights of this 1955 season include an invitation to play in the Meninak Bowl charity game, the 26-7 victory over Bradley, and the All-State selections of Paul Hutcheson, guard and captain; Ronnie Robbs, fullback; and Bobby Baskette, alternate captain and end.

Several Purple Pounders have signed grant-in-aid pacts with southern schools. Some of these are Bobby Rudesill, Auburn; Ronnie Robbs, Auburn; Paul Hutcheson, Georgia Tech; Bobby Baskette, University of Alabama; and Paul Elliot, University of Georgia.





## CENTRAL 42; PORTLAND 6

The Purple Pounders ripped Portland High School 42-6 in the mud at Chamberland Field for their third victory of the

season on September 24.

Practically every player got into the game, and five backs scored six touchdowns. Charles Cantrell, Benny Parks, John Davis, and Richard Henley each scored once, and Paul Elliott got two markers. Gene Etter had a perfect night at place-

ment with 6 for 6.

Perhaps more important than the smashing victory was the loss for the season of Charles Cantrell with "torn ligaments,"

Portland was completely out-classed by the driving backs, fierce tackles, and crisp blocking dealt out by the Pounders. Central used the pass as a reserve weapon while grinding out 324 yards. The surprising fact was that Central made only 10 first downs-a tribute to their breakaway run.

### CENTRAL 12: KINGSPORT 20

Again forced to play in ankle deep mud, September 30, at Kingsport, the Purple Pounders fell to the Kingsport Indians

Although Central led 6-0 on Ronnie Robbs 23-yard first quarter marker, Kingsport tied the score and then forged ahead 13-6. However, Central came roaring back to score on a 23-yard run by Paul Elliott, to trail by only one point at the half, 13-12. This stopped Central's scoring, but Kings-port added an insurance tally to win 20-12.

Central out gained the Indians 236 yards to 192 vards and also led in first downs 13 to 9. With a slippery ball, Central averaged 20.2 yards per punt and Kingsport 20.9. However, the Indians were out to average five straight defeats at the hands of the Pounders and gained their upset victory to hand the Pounders their second defeat of the season.

## CENTRAL 26; BRADLEY 7

In amassing 400 net yards, Central broke a six-game Bradley win streak with a resounding 26-7 victory, October 14, at Cleveland.

tion to being primarily responsible for the tumbles. One of the smallest groups of damp Chamberland field fans on record again saw the rugged Pounders' defense come through in addition to Robbs' running.

### CENTRAL 26: JORDAN 0

With Bobby Rudesill doing the pigskin carrying, Central gained a 6.0 haltime lead on Jordan. After Miss Patty Rector



Twenty-seven victories and two defeats was the record compiled by the 1955-1956 Purple Pounder Basketball Squad.



## COACH GORDON SMITH


