

In a fast moving age like our own, many changes take place over a period of fifty years. In September of 1907 Central High School opened her doors to meet a keenly felt need for secondary education in Hamilton County. At that time there was only felt need for secondary education in Hamilton County. At that time there was only one huilding, which comfortably cared for a student body of about two hundred and fifty students. With the building located in the center of the block, there was ample space around the building where the students might enjoy the out-of-doors during the lunch periods.

Since that time, with an ever growing population and an expanding building program in the City of Chattanooga, Central finds herself enclosed on both north and south sides by new wings and by additions covering the space east of the building. Today the three story structure occupies almost the entire ground space of the original below.

In a rapidly growing county like Hamilton and city like Chattanooga, more extensive grounds and a larger and more modern building would do much toward helping Central serve more adequately the demands of the community in the field of secondary education.





Central may point with pride to her educational achievements which through the years have kept in step with progress.

In 1937 two new wings were added which accommodated a more extensive art department, better equipped science laboratories, and one of the largest high school libraries in the South. With the growth of Central, have come new gymnasiums, well-equipped home economics and manual arts departments, and an auditorium with a stage adapted to a wide variety of programs. In 1955c-57 a fluorescent lighting system was installed throughout the entire building.

From an enrollment of two hundred and fifty students in 1907 and a faculty of twelve, Central has grown to a school of approximately two thousand with a faculty numbering seventy-eight in 1957.



In an effort to develop the well-rounded student, Central has, since the beginning, recognized the importance of training through social activities.

The first club at Central, the J.K.S. Society, was formed in 1909, From that beginning the number of clubs has gradually increased until at present there are approximately thirty-five social and service organizations. In the early years one of the first clubs was founded "to prove to the people of Chattanooga that Central could excel in something other than athletics." The Boys Literary Society was formed in 1910 to "help students overcome stage fright and build up self confidence."

Before acceptance by the school, each club must justify its existence by a worthwhile purpose and an acceptable constitution. Today Central clubs serve the needs of the school and the degree of the student for social admities.


In addition to the activities of the clubs, there are other functions at Central that have become traditional. Perhaps the most outstanding of these is the spring coronation on Senior Day of Mr. Central and Miss Central, who are selected by popular vote of the students on the basis of character, scholarship, leadership, and service. Other social high-lights are the Military Ball, the Senior Party, and the Junior-Senior Prom.

# ERITAGE IN ATHLETICS

Recognizing the importance of health and physical training, Central has, from the beginning, had a strong athletic and physical education department for both boys and girls.

The corps of teachers in this field has probably been unsurpassed by any other high school in the South. In 1909 Mr. James B. Rike, as coach, organized the first Central football team which that year won her first state championship, many of which have been listed since that time. Records available since Coach E. B. Etter has headed the staff show that Central has won one hundred and six games, lost forty, and tied ten. This is an unusual high school record for a period of fourteen years.

The first recorded basketball team was directed by Coach James B. Rike in 1910-11. In more recent years, under the superb coaching of Mr. W. P. Bales and Mr. Gordon Smith, Central's basketeers have many times been district, regional, and state champions.

For many seasons Central has dominated high school baseball in Chattanooga and in Tennessee, Other sports which have been popular are track, golf, and boxing.





#### IN MEMORIAM

Death, the grim reaper, is no respecter of persons; it strikes both old and young and sometimes takes the choicest and the best.

Tom Posey entered Central in 1955 from Tyner High School and soon became one of Central's most promising sophomores. He brought with him a good record which he consistently maintained.

Tom had great zest for living. He gave life his best and sought the best in return. He had intellectual curiosity and an insatiable desire to learn in different fields. Music held great interest for him. Not satisfied with playing the clarinet, his favorite instrument, he was eager to learn to play other instruments and to teach others to play his. He was a member of both the Central Band and the Orchestra, playing first chair clarinet in each organization.

According to those who knew Tom best, he was likable, dependable, and possessed a sense of humor. He was a hard worker; on his father's farm he and his brother bore the main responsibility while his father held a position away from home.

Scouting was another of Tom's interests. He was an Explorer Scout and had served as junior assistant to the scout master in his church group.

Tom was a member of the Concord Baptist Church where he took a leading part in the choir and young people's work. As a life work he was considering engineering or the ministry. On the fateful evening of his death, by automobile accident, June 3, 1955, he was returning with a church group from a youth meeting in a suburban area. On this her Golden Anniversary, Central could pay tribute to no more deserving group than to her own sons and daughters. Few, if any schools, have enjoyed through the years a more loyal or unfailing support of the alumni than has Central High School. The very mention of the name kindles in the heart an inexpressible warmth of feeling that only the true Centralite can know.

Of this great group, whose name is legion, none is more typical nor has been more genuinely faithful in working unselfishly and tirelessly for his Alma Mater than has Mr. J. William (Bill) Penney. No matter how difficult has been the task, no matter what the cost in effort, time, or money, Mr. Penney has ever been Central's unfailing and dependable friend.

# T H E 1956 F O O T B A L L

The Central Purple Pounders of 1956, sparked by their captain Benny Parks and alternate captains, Lonnie Styles and Jimmy Henley, rolled to a record of four wins, five losses, and two ties at the end of the season. The team was supported by Head Coach Red Etter, and assistant coaches -Stanley Farmer, Les Newton, Jake Seaton, W. B. Tate, and J. E. Hale.

Head Coach Red Etter has been at Central for fourteen years. He started his coaching career at the Fruitland Institution of Hendersonville, North Carolina, He came to Central in 1942 as assistant coach, and, then in 1943, he succeeded Coach Dean Petersen who was called into the service at that time,

Stanley Farmer has been an assistant coach and a teacher of physical education at Central for the past ten years. In city organizations he is a member of the American Legion, the Elks, and a lieutenant commander of the Naval Reserve

In addition to his duties as an assistant coach, Les Newton has served for a number of years as the Knothole Director of Rookie Baseball of Chattanooga and a teacher of science at Central where he has been since 1941.

After becoming interested in coaching at the East Ten-

nessee State Teachers College, Jake Seaton started his career as coach at Soddy Daisy High School, He has been primarily the "B" team coach in his eleven years at Central.

W. B. Tate was the captain of the 1949 Central football squad. After graduation he went to Western Kentucky and returned to Central to coach in 1954. He has been assistant coach and a teacher of science for the past two years.

A 1951 graduate of Central, J. E. Hale attended Western Kentucky for two years and later finished at the University of Chattanooga. He started as assistant coach and a teacher of history at Central in the fall of 1954,

The 1956 football team, facing one of the toughest schedules that any Pounder team has faced for many years, ended the season with a 4-5-2 record. In the concluding play of the season they lost by a small margin of one point in the Meninac Bowl in Jacksonville, Florida. On the whole the team is to be commended. The 1956 team was inexperienced in having to fill places of leadership left vacant by seniors of the previous year.





Before the Chamberlain Field grandstand filled with enthusiastic Cleveland rooters and Central fans, on the evening of October 12, the Pounders in their second victory of the season downed the Bradley Bears 27-0, Central's scoring was made by James Reece on a 14-yard run; Davis on a two yard run; Pavis on a 32 yard run; and on a four yard pass play from Etter to Bill Sachse. Etter scored three extra points. Two key plays were Parks' 32-yard run and a 33-yard return of a pass interception by James Mallett.

## CENTRAL 14; KNOXVILLE FULTON 20

Helped along by a 15-yard penalty in the last minute, Knoxville Fulton defeated the Pounders on Fulton's home field. After Fulton had scored 14 points, Etter fired a pass to John Davis from the 46 and then Davis huslled twenty yards for a touchdown. Central tied the game by marching from its own 30 to Fulton's 30 in five plays; Etter again pitched to Davis for a 38-yard touchdown pass. Fulton's winning score came with 10 seconds left in the ball game.

#### CENTRAL 14; OAK RIDGE 34 November 2

The Central Purple Pounders lost to the Oak Ridge Wildcats, who were number one in the state by Litkenhouse ratings at that time. The Pounders scored more points against Oak Ridge than any preceding team who had played them. Oak Ridge opened the scoring in the first period when Central fumbled in their first series of plays, but the Pounders came right back with a 61-yard march. With Gene Etter handing off to John Davis and James Reece, the Purples finally scored as Reece plunged from the two yard line. Central took the lead early in the second quarter, when Chink Brown handed off to Davis, who threw six yards to Etter in the end zone on the second play of the quarter. He scored on a 22-yard pass play from Chink Brown, on a beautiful 13 yard run, and a 2-yard smash over tackle, James Reece scored on a two yarder over guard. Jimmy Cheek intercepted a pass and ran 59 yards with the ball before being knocked out of bounds on the six yard line. The Pounders allowed him to get the talley as he carried three straight times and finally made the TD from the one for the last touchdown. In spite of defeats, Central closed her regular schedule with a victory of 24 to 0.

#### CENTRAL 6; ROBERT E. LEE 7 November 30

In the annual Meninac Bowl game, on Friday following Thanksgiving Week, Central played the third ranking team of Florida, Robert E. Lee High School of Jacksonville. It was a close game all the way through. Robert E. Lee made the first touchdown to make the score 7-0. Central got their touchdown later in the game with a 5-yarder on a wide pitchout from Etter to Parks, but failed to get the extra point, so Robert E. Lee won by the small margin of 7-6. Accompanying the team on this trip were the Central Band and Drill Squad who at the half time put on a show of which any school might be proud.

# 1957 BASKETBALL



# R. O. T. C.

The Central High School Reserve Officers Training Corps has maintained an excellent straight A-1 rating through the thirty-eight years since its organization in 1919. This rating is determined by the Federal Inspection which comes in the spring as a climax of each year's work.

The head of the ROTC Department in 1957 is Major G. J. Kronenberger, Professor of Military Science and Tactics. The instructors are M/Sgt. Robert Hall, SFC Robert Shelton, and SFC Glen Ashley. M/Sgt. W. J. Reed is the non-commissioned officer in charge at Central.

Two years of military training are required of all physically-fit male students; the third year is optional. The military course is composed largely of drill and classroom instruction which will better fit the cadet to face life's problems.
