Both faculty and student body, as well as a wide circle of friends, were stunned and deeply grieved when the report spread abroad that Marion Perkins, better known to his friends as Perk, had met a tragic death on Sunday morning, May 12, 1957.

Mr. Perkins came to Central in September, 1954, as a teacher of history. Previous to that time he had

served as football cach, first at Tyner High and later at Red Bank High School. During his three years at Central, he was a cooperative and loyal member of the faculty, a conscientious and meticulous tacher who had a deep concern for the welfare of his studen's and expected nothing less than their teacher who had a deep concern for the welfare of his studen's and expected nothing less than their best effort in their work.

He received his early education in the elementary schools of the city and at Baylor School for Boys;
he later attended the University of Tennessee where he made an envisible record as an outside stated, attended the saketball and football. Numbered among his close friends were well known coaches of the country

The admiration and love which his boys held for him were evidenced by a testimonial banquet given at the Read House in his honor at the time of his retirement from the coaching field. Mr. Sam McConnel, the present Superintendent of Schools of Hamilton Country, served as master of ceremonies.

Mr. Perkins' friends who knew him best had a deep sense of appreciation of his sense of humor, his consideration and thoughtfulness for older people and above all for his generosity, loyalty, and honesty.







B-Team Coach "Boots" Seaton made his contribution to the year's success in building men for future championship teams.



1957-'58 Basketball Season

The Central High School Purple Pounder Basketball Team of 1958 came through a difficult season with a total of 33 wins and only 4 losses. They completed an unusually successful regular season and went on to the district regional, and state tournaments to lose the State Championship by the margin of only one point, being defeated by Lenoir City on Saturday evening, March 15, at the Vanderbilt Memorial Gymnasium with a score of 34-33.


Captain Eddie Test scored a total of 826 points for the season with 722 rebounds. This set not only a team record but also a record in the district. In the state tournament he likewise set a record with a total of 65 rebounds. Eddie was named the most valuable player in the Times Cup Series, the Scottsboro Tournament, the District Tournament, Regional Tournament, and in the State of Tennessee.

Some other players who made major contributions to the success of the season were Bill Culpepper, Jerry Summers, Ronnie Cole, Kenneth Connelly, and Webb Cate. The entire team furnished excellent support and cooperation.

The players of the 1957-1958 Basketball Team accumulated many honors. Bill Culpepper and Eddie Test were named to the All Times Cup Team. Ronnie Cole and Eddie Test were named to the Scottsboro Invitational. Eddie Test and Jerry Summers were Central's representatives on both the All District and All Regional teams.

In the six years that Coach Gordon Smith has been coaching basketball at Central, there has been no other team that has played as many games as did the Basketball Team of 1958. They played a total of 37 games, only 4 of which they lost.

This team will go down in basketball history as one of the finest Central has ever produced.



Under the leadership of Coach Etter and J. C. Cooper, captain, the team of 1957 ended the regular season with thirteen wins and two losses. By the end of the District, Region, and State Tournaments, they had compiled a record of eighteen wins and five losses.

After a City Prep League season record of thirteen victories, the Pounders continued to win the District and Region Championships.

Perhaps one of the most exciting games of the year came when J. C. Cooper pitched a no hitter against City High School for the District Championship.

The pitching staff, consisting of J. C. Cooper and David Vaughn, turned out great performances and added much to the strength of the team.

In the batting department the standouts were Gene Etter, Jimmy Henly, and Ronnie Kincer.

Other members who contributed greatly to the success of the team, were Charles McLaughton, Lonnie Green, Jerry Summers, Eddie Test, and James Reece.
