Never has a generation faced such amazing and challenging horizons as those confronting the class of 1958.

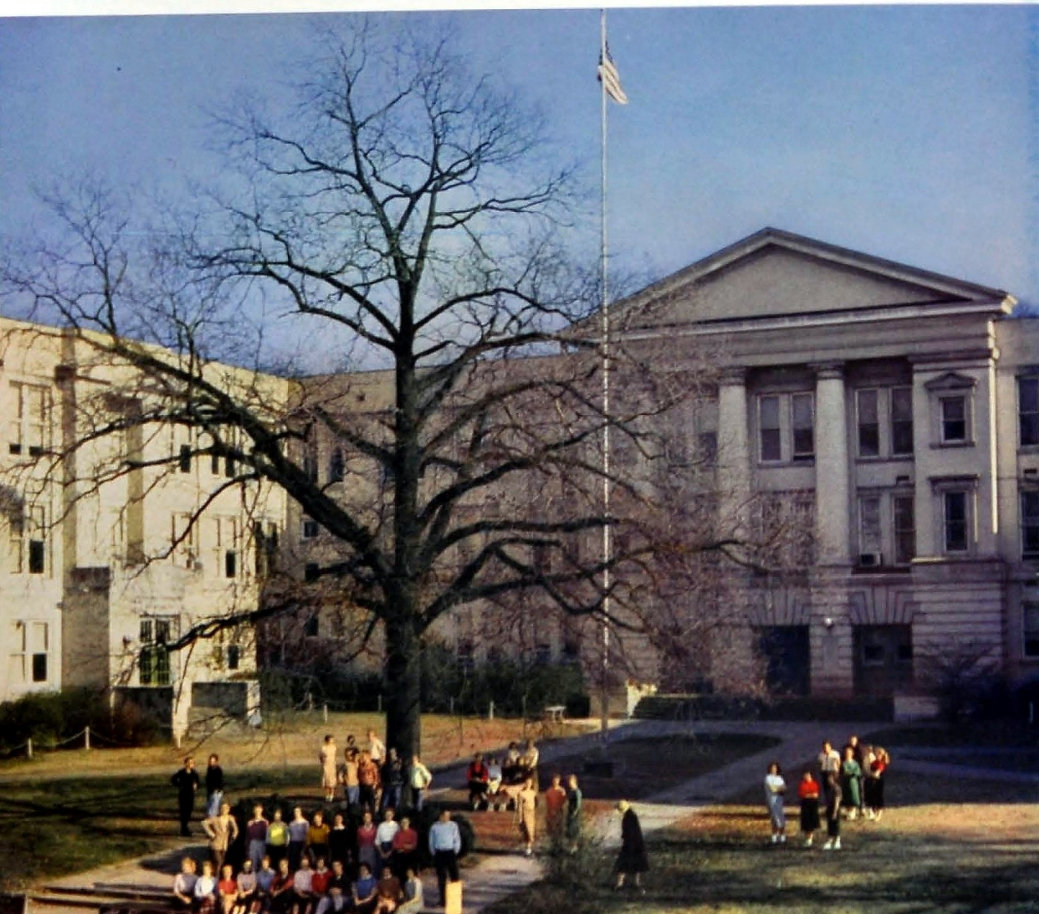

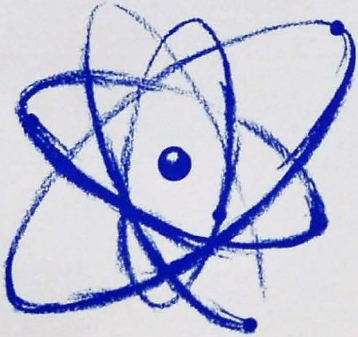
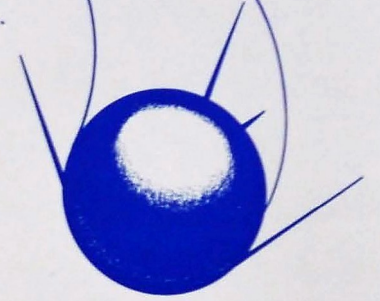
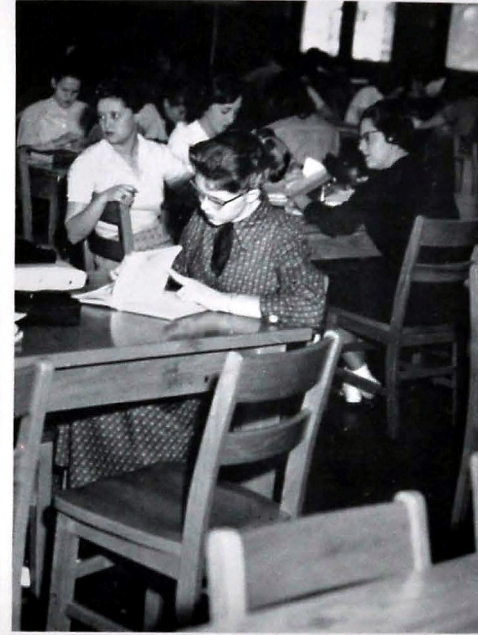
Everywhere, on every hand, the world feels the impact of the race for the command of space. Having only recently passed her half-century mark, Central, virile and alert to progress and

IN MEMORIAM

Both faculty and student body, as well as a wide circle of friends, were stunned and deeply grieved when the report spread abroad that Marion Perkins, better known to his friends as Perk, had met a tragic death on Sunday morning, May 12, 1957.

Mr. Perkins came to Central in September, 1954, as a teacher of history. Previous to that time he had served as football coach, first at Tyner High and later at Red Bank High School. During his three years at Central, he was a cooperative and loyal member of the faculty, a conscientious and meticulous teacher who had a deep concern for the welfare of his students and expected nothing less than their best effort in their work.

He received his early education in the elementary schools of the city and at Baylor School for Boys; he later attended the University of Tennessee where he made an enviable record as an outstanding athlete, lettering in both basketball and football. Numbered among his close friends were well known coaches of the country.

The admiration and love which his boys held for him were evidenced by a testimonial banquet given at the Read House in his honor at the time of his retirement from the coaching field. Mr. Sam McConnell, the present Superintendent of Schools of Hamilton County, served as master of ceremonies.

Mr. Perkins' friends who knew him best had a deep sense of appreciation of his sense of humor, his consideration and thoughtfulness for older people and above all for his generosity, loyalty, and honesty.

A FACULTY TRIBUTE TO MISS RACHEL McALLISTER

It is difficult to realize that we are honoring today the memory of one who for so many years directed the devotional program at Central High School.

Miss Rachel McAllister brought distinction to our school in being the first Bible teacher in the public school system of Chattanooga. We are proud of her!

She was beautifully prepared for her work, having earned both the Bachelor's and the Master's degrees, having twice visited Palestine, and also made trips to Europe. Only two summers ago she went to England and to Scotland.

She was a true Christian whose desire as she taught Bible was to fulfill the Great Command, "Go ye into all the world and preach the Gospel to every creature."

She was alert in bringing to Central missionaries and religious leaders from various foreign countries that we might know better the needs of the people whom they represented.

She held a high standard for duty; but in every circumstance, Miss McAllister manifested her Christian faith by doing all she could and leaving the rest to God.

She lived her Christianity. Guests in her home were impressed with the motto, "As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord."

We are indebted to her for sponsoring the early morning prayer service, the daily devotions at assembly, and the work of the Bible Club. We prize also the numerous Bible scholarships that she secured for her students.

Her loyalty to Central High School and her love for the students and faculty were outstanding. In a self-effacing way, she could do more things for more people at the right time in the right way than almost anyone else we have ever known.

In all sincerity, she caused us to feel that she just loved doing things for us. This was a part of her daily creed for living, and she lived joyously.

In addition to her consecrated living, which was fraught with so much good, the faculty have treasured her kindness, her sense of humor, and the warmth of her friendship.

Her loyalty to Central High School and her love for the students and faculty were outstanding. In a self-effacing way, she could do more things for more people at the right time in the right way than almost anyone else we have ever known.

It is impossible for us to estimate the far-reaching influence of her spiritually animated life. Alfred Lord Tennyson expressed this thought for us as he stood on the shores of a Lake in Killarney listening to the echoes of bugle notes as they resounded across the water. Turning to his companion he said,

"O love, they die in you rich days,
They laze on hill or field or river;
Our echoes roll from soul to soul,
And grow forever and forever..."

Miss McAllister truly lived a triumphant Christian life, and we are told that she passed to her reward triumphantly.

We shall treasure her memory.

The CHAMPION has the privilege again this year for the third time to present those students who have excelled in various departments and who have been chosen by the teachers of that department for this outstanding recognition.

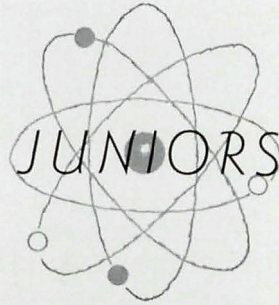

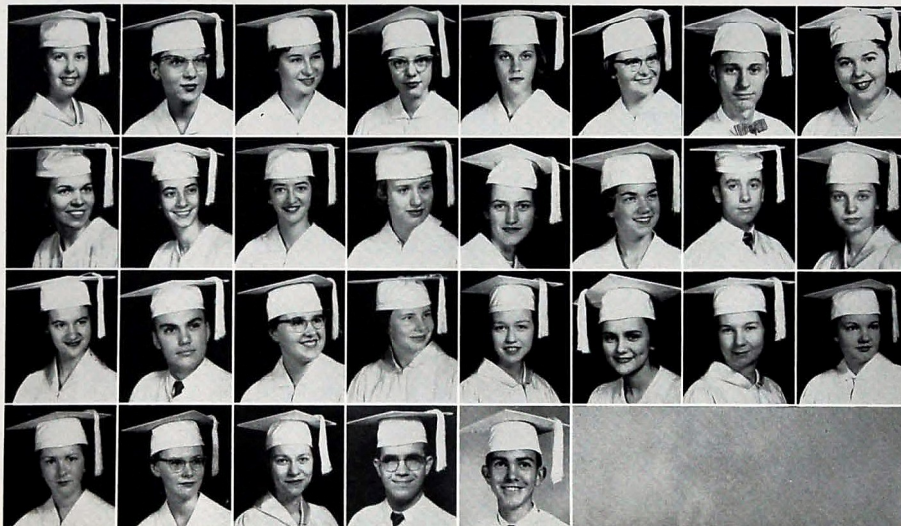
The Four-Year Honor Students are seniors who have maintained 3.5 average or above in their high school courses.

Not only was the team tops but the coaching staff also took the lead. Coach Etter, for the second time, was hon-

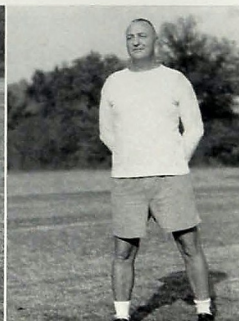
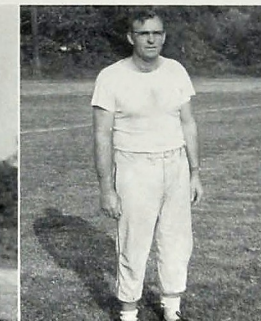

The Redmen went in front 14-13 in the third period, but Central came back with a 19-14 lead at the end. In the final quarter, Kingsport pushed for a 20-19 edge. Ted Carson, herd running halfback, broke through a hole at left guard on the next play and went 60 yards for the winning touchdown of the game. Carson's hard-running contributed much to the victory. In the closing minutes it seemed that the Indians would score again, but time ran out to give Central her fourth straight victory.

There were four minutes and twenty seconds left to play when Lee made the second touchdown, clinching the score 14-0 in Lee's favor. Thus ended the eleventh game of one of the Pounders' best seasons of Central's football history.

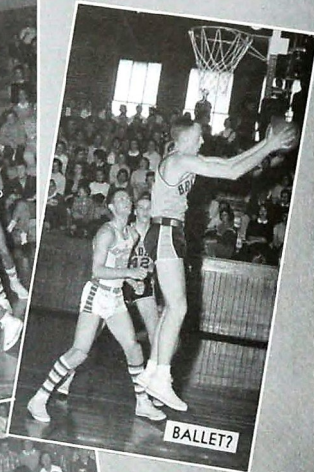
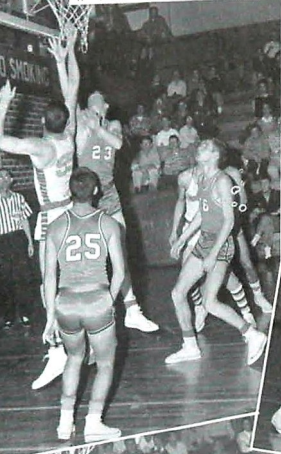

The Central High School Purple Pounder Basketball Team of 1958 came through a difficult season with a total of 33 wins and only 4 losses. They completed an unusually successful regular season and went on to the district regional, and state tournaments to lose the State Championship by the margin of only one point, being defeated by Lenoir City on Saturday evening, March 15, at the Vanderbilt Memorial Gymnasium with a score of 34-33.

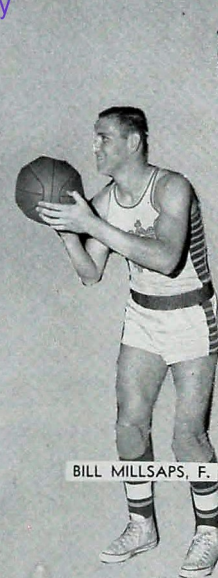
Captain Eddie Test scored a total of 826 points for the season with 722 rebounds. This set not only a team record but also a record in the district. In the state tournament he likewise set a record with a total of 65 rebounds. 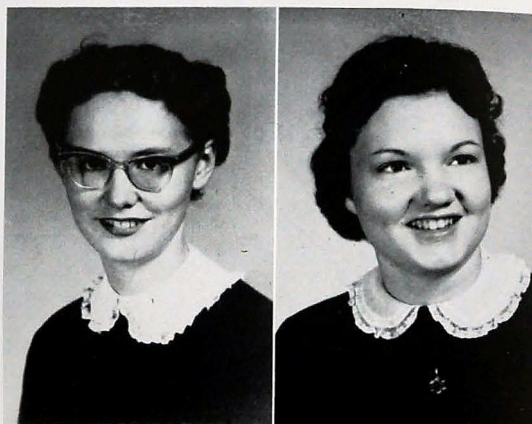
1958 CHAMPION
