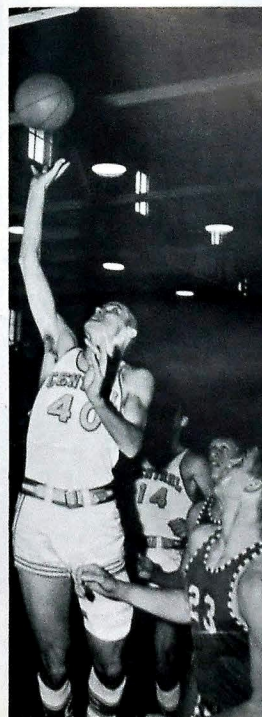
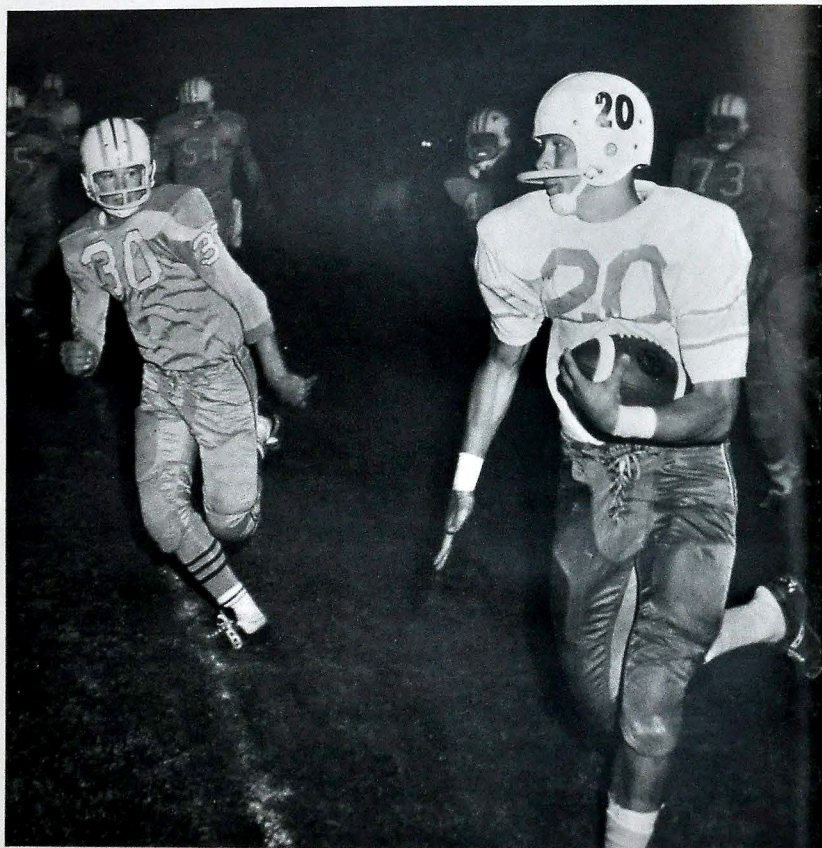
Co-operation enters into every phase of life at Central High School.

Central High has always been outstanding in the field of sports.

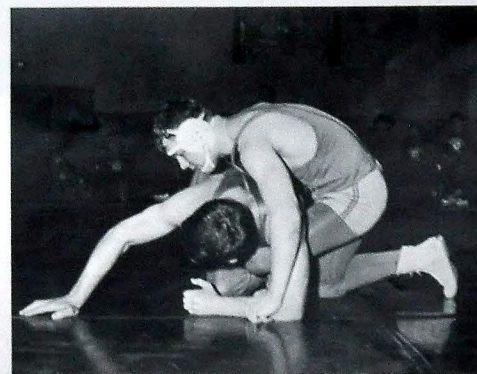
This statement is supported by the fact that we are always considered top competition by opposing teams.

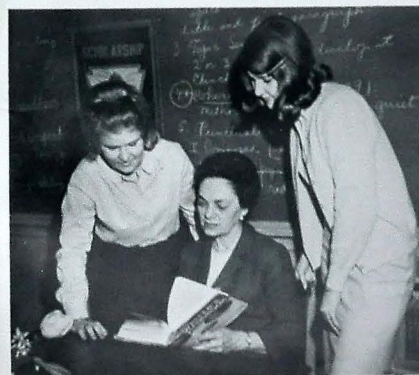

Department of Art

The purpose of the art department is to give a special means for personal and individual experience, thus helping to increase the realization of ones own worth as a human being capable of doing something worthwhile, and responsible for using well his peculiar abilities. Experience is offered in drawing with pencil, ink, charcoal, chalks, and other mediums; in watercolor and oil paints; in ceramics, in weaving, in sculpture of wood, clay, stone, metal, and other materials; in print making; in stitchery; and various other crafts. Preceding these activities every art student studies the basic elements of design: color, line, light and dark, two and three dimensional form.

A library of about 500 volumes covering all phases of art, the important periodical literature on art, and extensive files are kept in the art department and are immediately available when needed. The class room is well equipped for a limited number of students in the fields offered.

Department of English

The English Department, composed of thirteen instructors, offers courses to meet the needs of all students in the school. In addition to the basic courses in composition, vocabulary, and drill, special features of the department are courses in reading, journalism, creative writing, speech, and dramatics. Both school publications, the *Digest* and the *CHAMPION* are sponsored by the English department.

Department of Foreign Languages

In our Foreign Language Department we are trying to develop facility in reading and writing the language, together with a more realistic approach to understanding and speaking the language.

To achieve the latter, the role of the language laboratory in the instrumental program looms increasingly important since it provides regular practice in listening and repeating the foreign language as presented by educated natives. Listening practice is intended to lead to the ability to understand the spoken language and the acquisition of a language should be of real value in attaining this goal, not to mention its value as a means of motivating the student in his language efforts.





Department of Guidance

Guidance is an organized program through which we help boys and girls to understand and to use wisely the educational, the vocational, personal potentialities, and the opportunities which they have, or can develop. With such a concern, a wholesome climate should prevail for all students to develop a positive manner. Counselors are willing to assist all students in all school problems. Mr. Hale is the director of the program at Central, and Mrs. Okrasinski is the assisting counselor. Guidance services are thought of as organized activities designed to give systematic aid to pupils to assist in their learning about the large and complex changing world of opportunities.

Department of History

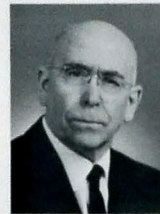
The History Department, led by Mrs. Virginia Skates, offers a number of courses in order to improve the quality of citizenship and to help students understand national and world problems.

In Memoriam Charles Ryans

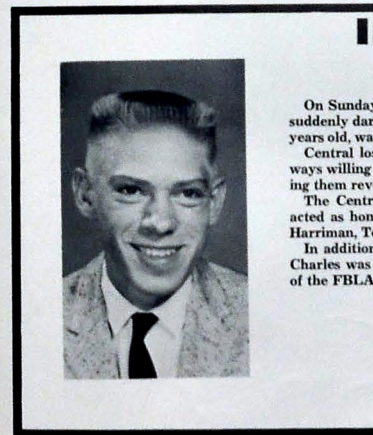

Although the top award may not be achieved, those who have tried their best know that the work has been worthwhile. Of course, it's not all work and no play.

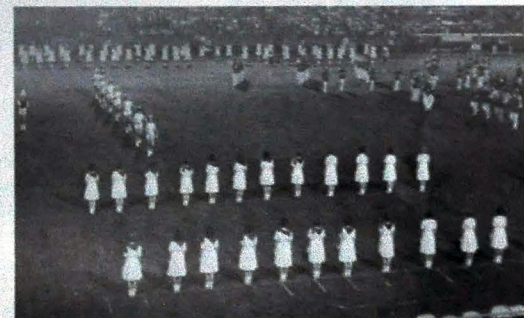

The Reserve Officers Training Corps at Central High School was established by order of the Secretary of War, Washington, D. C., December 29, 1919, Bulletin No. 43. During the forty-six years, ROTC has become an integral part of the school curricula with its basic mission to lay the foundation of intelligent citizenship by inculcation in the cadet, habits of precision, orderliness, courtesy, correctness of posture and deportment, leadership, and respect for loyalty to constituted authority, and to give the student basic military training. Classes are conducted on leadership, drill and command, map reading, care and cleaning of weapons and equipment, small unit tactics, first aid, and other subjects related to the history and organization of the army.

Central's greatest stumbling stone was City. City, Central's arch rival, defeated the Pounders three times. All these games were close except the 48-36 whitewashing we took from them.

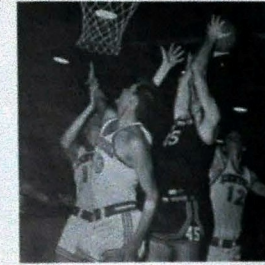
