

of Reverence



My best wishes shall follow you throughout the years.








IN MEMORIAM

Department of Art

The purpose of the art department is to give a special means for personal and individual experience, thus helping to increase the realization of ones own worth as a human being capable of doing something worthwhile, and responsible for using well his peculiar abilities. Experience is offered in drawing with pencil, ink, charcoal, chalks, and other mediums; in watercolor and oil paints; in ceramics, in weaving, in sculpture of wood, clay, stone, metal, and other materials; in print making; in stitchery; and various other crafts. Preceding these activities every art student studies the basic elements of design: color, line, light and dark, two and three dimensional form. A library of about 50 volumes covering all phases of art, the important periodical literature on art, and extensive files are kept in the art department and are immediately available when needed. The class room is well equipped for a limited number of students in the fields offered.

The English Department, composed of thirteen instructors, offers courses to meet the needs of all students in the school. In addition to the basic courses in composition, vocabulary, and drill, special features of the department are courses in reading, journalism, creative writing, speech, and dramatics. Both school publications, the Digest and the Champion are sponsored by the English department.

The Business Education Department offers a curriculum consisting of ten business subjects. From these ten subjects, students are able to secure the necessary training, for employment upon graduation, in one of the following office positions: secretarial, bookkeeping, stenographic, or clerical.

Department of Foreign Languages

In our Foreign Language Department we are trying to develop facility in reading and writing the language, together with a more realistic approach to understanding and speaking the language.

To achieve the latter, the role of the language laboratory in the instrumental program looms increasingly important since it provides regular practice in listening and repeating the foreign language as presented by educated natives. Listening practice is intended to lead to the ability to understand the spoken language and the acquisition of a language should be of real value in attaining this goal, not to mention its value as a means of motivating the student in his language efforts.















Department of Guidance

Guidance is an organized program through which we help boys and girls to understand and to use wisely the educational, the vocational, personal potentialities, and the opportunities which they have, or can develop. With such a concern, a wholesome climate should prevail for all students to develop a positive manner. Counselors are willing to assist all students in all school problems. Mr. Hale is the director of the program at Central, and Mrs. Okrasinski is the assisting counselor. Guidance services are thought of as organized activities designed to give systematic aid to pupils to assist in their learning about the large and complex changing world of opportunities.

The History Department, led by Mrs. Virginia Skates, offers a number of

courses in order to improve the quality of citizenship and to help students

understand national and world problems.

Tennessee history is taught in the seventh grade, and United States history is

taught in the eighth grade. Bible is offered in grades nine through twelve.

World history is open to sophomore, junior, and senior students; and

American history is required in the senior year.

Department of Home Economics

Students in the Home Economics Department get acquainted with the problems met by the entire family: Physical, social, material, and emotional. Consideration of individual problems such as reducing diets, personal grooming, and proper styling of clothes, adds to the self-confidence of the individual.

One of the basic objectives of home economics is to raise the standards of home living. This purpose is provided by a program which includes budgeting, management, child care, clothing, planning, and preparation for nutriants and balanced meals.

Department of Industrial Arts

The Industrial Arts Department is led by Mr. J. J. Fletcher. This department includes mechanical drawing, woodworking, printing, and auto mechanics with a major offered in each. The purpose of this department is to give students knowledge and guidance in practical skills useful for future occupations. This year there are three hundred, fifteen students enrolled in these useful courses.















Department of Mathematics

The mathematics curriculum consists of those courses, activities, and units of instruction designed to contribute to the common and specialized mathematics needs of secondary-school pupils. The curriculum places particular stress on developing accuracy and facility in the use of computational processes in practical situations. Provisions are made for pupils to develop skills and abilities in the mathematics areas of geometry, graphic representation and interpretation, elementary analysis, and scientific thinking.

Department of Music

Our Music Department is one of the best, with opportunities for all in almost any field of music in which one wishes to participate.

Music hath charm, but in preparing music so these charms will be heard by the listener, the performer will acquire many of the attributes that are characteristic to good music. A few of these are: character, mental and physical poise, memory, dependability, imagination, rapidity of thought, muscular control, and most of all the ability to distinguish the tawdry from the beautiful. We feel the student will profit in all of these by participating in our musical organizations.

Department of Physical Education

The Physical Education Department offers students: Physical fitness through formal gymnastics, training in good sportsmanship through intermural programs and athletics, Health and safety education through visual aids, civil defense, and first aid; responsibility and leadership through team captains and student help. The highlight of the years work is May Day, when outstanding students of the department are recognized.

Department of Science

The Science Department is composed of seven instructors with Dr. Edward
Owens as head. Included in the department are general science, biology,
chemistry, physics, and photography. During the present school year there are
slightly more than one thousand students enrolled within the department,
whose purpose is to instruct the students in scientific knowledge and its
practical application.











Department of Social Science

The chief purpose of education is to train every student to become the best citizen he is capable of being. The social science subjects have the above purpose. They cannot achieve this aim entirely; they contribute to the achievement of it. Civics, economics, sociology, and phychology are comparatively new subjects. They seek to aquaint the student with his background and environment and to contribute to his maximum usefulness in our society.

Department of Speech

The Speech and Drama Department is convinced that oral communication is a necessary and stimulating part of our daily life and that learning to improve oneself in it can be a pleasurable as well as a profitable experience. Consequently our purpose is not primarily to propose speech-contest winners, orators, debaters, or entertainers as such, but rather to develop in our young citizens a liking for oral expression and an awareness of its increasing importance. It is toward these ends that we have directed our efforts, emphasizing aims related to our philosophy, suggesting topics for thoughtful discussion, insisting upon careful planning of speech activities, encouraging the building of vocabulary, stressing the function of communication in buman endeavor, and providing activities that are varied enough to give every student a reasonable degree of satisfaction in oral expression.

The Reserve Officers Training Corps at Central High School was established by order of the Secretary of War, Washington, D. C., December 29, 1919, Bulletin No. 43. During the forty-six years, ROTC has become an integral part of the school curricula with its basic mission to lay the foundation of intelligent citizenship by inculcation in the cadet, habits of precision, orderliness, courtesy, correctness of posture and deportment, leadership, and respect for lovalty to constituted authority, and to give the student basic military training. Classes are conducted on leadership, drill and command, map reading, care and cleaning of weapons and equipment, small unit tactics, first aid, and other subjects related to the history and organization of the army.
